<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians Trust Fund

<b><u>Purpose</u></b> To deposit revenue payments received by the state from the Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians pursuant to the terms of the amended tribal-state gaming compact ratified pursuant to Government Code section 12012.58 and any trust fund agreement executed by the state and the tribe pursuant to that tribal-state gaming compact. Funds transferred from the trust fund to the Commission are expended in amounts necessary for specific purposes enumerated in the amended compact, including, but not limited to (1) governmental operations of the tribe, and (2) reduction of the tribe's existing debt related to its gaming facility.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> California Gambling Control Commission/Org 0855		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Revenue payments from the Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Pursuant to Government Code section 12012.585 (f), any funds remaining in the trust fund at the time it is terminated shall revert to the tribe.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Government Code section 12012.585 (b) provides that notwithstanding section 13340, there is continuously appropriated without regard to fiscal years, from the trust fund to the California Gambling Control Commission, the amount necessary for the specific purposes enumerated in the tribal-state gaming compact.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from Indian tribes which are not taxed.
