<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> Hazardous Waste Enforcement Training Fund		
<b><u>Legal Citation/Authority</u></b> Chapter 1187, Statutes of 1986 Health and Safety Code section 25192		
<b><u>Fund Classification</u></b> <b><u>GAAP Basis</u></b> Governmental/Special Revenue Funds	<b><u>Fund Classification</u></b> <b><u>Legal Basis</u></b> Governmental/General Fund Special Accounts	
<b><u>Purpose</u></b> This fund is a depository for penalties collected to support hazardous waste and hazardous materials enforcement training.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Office of Criminal Justice Planning/Org 8100		
<b><u>Major Sources</u></b> Two hundred dollars (\$200) of each imposed civil or criminal penalty.		
<b><u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u></b> Support the training of local, county, and state hazardous waste and hazardous materials enforcement personnel in the investigation and prosecution of hazardous waste and hazardous materials violations.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Section 25192 of the Health and Safety Code provides that the moneys in the fund may be expended by the Office of Criminal Justice Planning, upon appropriation by the Legislature, for the purposes specified.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> <b>Always Excluded</b> – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from penalties.		
<b><u>Comments/ Historical Information</u></b> OCJP/8100 is abolished effective January 1, 2004, pursuant to Chapter 157, Statutes of 2003. This fund is therefore administratively abolished pursuant to Government Code 13306 (b).
