<u>Purpose</u> This fund is a depository for moneys transferred annually from the California Unitary Fund to establish in the state an additional supercomputer center in coordination with the Technology Center of Silicon Valley and the San Diego Supercomputer Center. To provide an investment package of up to two million dollars (\$2,000,000) annually, for the 1989-90, 1990-91, and 1991-92 fiscal years, for the graphics and animations facility at the San Diego Supercomputer Center and seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000), including forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) in private sector matching funds, for a study regarding the development and operation of an additional supercomputer center in coordination with the Technology Center of Silicon Valley and the San Diego Supercomputer Center.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Unitary Fund Programs/ Org 2225		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> An annual appropriation from the California Unitary Fund of \$2,000,000 for each of the 1989-90, 1990-91, and the 1991-92 fiscal years.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Pursuant to Government Code section 16346, absent any successor fund being named, the balance remaining in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Section 16429.51 of the Government Code provides that the funds transferred to the Account "are hereby appropriated" for the purposes specified.		
<u>State Appropriations Limit</u> Always Excluded.		
<u>Comments/Historical Information</u> The original organization code for this fund was 2200/Department of Commerce. This chapter shall become inoperative on June 30, 1992, and, as of January 1, 1993, is repealed.
