<u>Purpose</u> This chapter authorized the transfer of moneys from the California Industries for the Blind Manufacturing Fund to the Opportunity Work Center Revolving Fund in quantities necessary to carry out the operations of the fund. The fund is used for the purchase of materials and supplies of for the purchase or rental of equipment needed in the manufacturing, fabricating, or assembly of products at any opportunity work center operated under the jurisdiction of the department. It is also used for payment of salaries of blind and otherwise handicapped persons engaged in manufacturing, fabricating, or assembly opportunity work centers. It may be used for the payment of the cost of distribution of products.		
<u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u> Department of Rehabilitation/Org 5160		
<u>Major Revenue Source</u> Proceeds from sales at opportunity work centers.		
<u>Disposition of Fund (upon abolishment)</u> Purchase of materials and supplies and operative costs. Purchase of rental of equipment needed in manufacturing. Transfers of sums in excess of needs to the General Fund.		
<u>Appropriation Authority</u> Section 19609 of the Welfare and Institutions Code provides that the "fund shall be used for the purchase of material and supplies or for the purchase or rental of equipment needed in the manufacturing, fabricating, or assembly of products, and for the payment of salaries of blind workers and otherwise handicapped persons engaged in such manufacturing, fabricating, or assembly at any opportunity work center operated under the jurisdiction of the department."		

State Appropriations Limit

Always Excluded – Revenues in this fund are not proceeds of taxes and even after transfer, will never become proceeds of taxes because the major revenue source is derived from a Working Capital and Revolving Fund.

Historical Comments

Chapter 1624, Statutes of 1959 originally created this fund in the Education Code.

Chapter 1107, Statutes of 1969 amended the law to include this fund in the Welfare and Institutions Code.

This fund is abolished effective January 1, 1985, pursuant to Chapter 277, Statutes of 1984.
