<b><u>Legal Title</u></b> Dry Cleaning Account, Bureau of Home Furnishings and Thermal Insulation Fund

<b><u>Purpose</u></b> This fund serves as a depository for registration fees collected from all dry cleaning plants operating in this state for the purpose of regulation, as specified. It also supports the administering of registration requirements as well as funding the actual costs of developing and maintaining a registration list.		
<b><u>Administering Agency/Organization Code</u></b> Department of Consumer Affairs, Bureau of Home Furnishings/Org 1110		
<b><u>Major Revenue Source</u></b> Registration fees of not more than \$75 for each dry cleaning plant.		
<b><u>Disposition of Funds (upon abolishment)</u></b> Absent any language naming a successor fund, any remaining balance in this fund upon abolishment shall be transferred to the General Fund pursuant to Government Code 16346.		
<b><u>Appropriation Authority</u></b> Section 19236 of the Business and Professions Code provides that all moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated.		
<b><u>State Appropriations Limit</u></b> Excluded.		
<b><u>Comments/Historical Information</u></b> Chapter 1135, Statutes of 1992 revised the Business and Professions Code section 19236 to establish an abolishment date of January 1, 1993. When this fund was originally established an abolishment date was not established.
