Amendment to Various Budget Bill Items, Support, Air Resources Board

Specialized Diesel Enforcement Section—It is requested that Item 3900-001-0044 be increased by \$896,000 and Item 3900-001-0421 be increased by \$897,000 to collectively fund 10 positions to form a specialized enforcement team that will focus diesel emission enforcement efforts at warehouses and distribution centers within or near disadvantaged communities.

Mobile Source Audit and Compliance—It is requested that Item 3900-001-0044 be increased by \$128,000, Item 3900-001-0115 be increased by \$1,750,000, Item 3900-001-0421 be increased by \$12,000, Item 3900-001-3228 be increased by \$18,000, and Item 3900-001-3237 be increased by \$52,000 to collectively fund 9 positions to enhance the Air Resources Board's mobile source emission oversight program based on lessons learned from the Volkswagen case.

Implementation of Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017 (SB 1)—It is requested that Item 3900-001-0044 be increased by \$69,000, Item 3900-001-0115 be increased by \$51,000, Item 3900-001-0421 be increased by \$7,000, Item 3900-001-3228 be increased by \$10,000, and Item 3900-001-3237 be increased by \$28,000 to collectively fund 1 position for implementation of SB 1. These resources will be used to evaluate the information technology (IT) needs for relevant data systems to implement SB 1, and develop a project description for review by the appropriate IT entities.

Amendment to Budget Bill Item 3940-001-0001, Support, State Water Resources Control Board

Drought Resources: Updated Request—It is requested that Item 3940-001-0001 be decreased by \$4,724,000. The Governor's Budget proposed \$5,324,000 for drought-related activities. Executive Order B-40-17 lifted the Governor's previous drought declaration in all but four counties. As a result of improved and significantly increased precipitation this year, the State Water Resources Control Board no longer requires additional resources for water curtailments and emergency change petitions. The requested reduction will maintain a budget of \$600,000 to support 4 positions that are necessary for the conclusion of open drought-related compliance and enforcement issues currently underway at the State Water Resources Control Board.

Implementation of Conservation Responsibilities—It is requested that the State Water Resources Control Board's authority be increased by 5 positions to establish a new conservation unit within the Office of Research, Planning, and Performance to support efforts consistent with the April 2017 report "Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life."

Amendment to and Addition of Various Budget Bill Items, Support, Department of Toxic Substances Control

Exide Closure Plan—It is requested that Item 3960-011-3301 be added to provide a \$1.4 million loan annually for three years from the Lead-Acid Battery Cleanup Fund to the Hazardous Waste Control Account (see Attachment 1). The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is required to hire a third party quality assurance contractor to oversee the Exide Closure Plan implementation as specified in the final closure plan agreement. While Exide Technologies is financially responsible for this work, it is unknown when Exide will reimburse DTSC. Therefore, it is necessary to provide DTSC with sufficient resources to enable prompt payment of the third party contractor. This loan will allow DTSC to cover the costs of these oversight services until Exide provides reimbursement.

It is also requested that Item 3960-001-0014 be increased by \$1.4 million annually for three years to support DTSC's Exide Closure Plan implementation.

National Priorities List and State Orphan Sites—It is requested that the following items be amended and added to provide resources necessary to support the state's share of costs for National Priorities List (Superfund) sites, Priority 1A and 1B state orphan sites, and continued cleanup activities for Priority 2 and 3 state orphan sites that are already underway. The cleanup work includes site investigation, characterization, cleanup, and remediation activities, among others. More specifically, the following actions are requested:

- Increase Item 3960-001-0106 by \$500,000
- Increase Item 3960-001-0115 by \$2.7 million
- Add Item 3960-001-0193 in the amount of \$500,000

It is also requested that provisional language be added to Items 3960-001-0106, 3960-001-0115, and 3960-001-0193 to allow the use of penalty revenues to support these cleanup projects (see Attachment 2). Combined with \$10,908,000 transferred from the Toxic Substances Control Account to the Site Remediation Account included in the Governor's Budget, this proposal provides a total of \$14,608,000 for Superfund and state orphan sites.

Amendment to Budget Bill Items 3970-001-0133 and 3970-001-0387, Support, Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery

Enhanced Oversight, Audit, and Enforcement in the Beverage Container Recycling Program—It is requested that Item 3970-001-0133 be increased by \$2,270,000 and 22 positions to increase and enhance the oversight, audit, and enforcement functions within the Beverage Container Recycling Program. This request reflects the permanent authorization of the following activities:

- 5 positions and \$592,000 California Beverage Container Recycling Fund (BCRF) to maintain the increased audit coverage of beverage manufacturers and distributors.
- 7 positions and \$733,000 BCRF to continue the Imported Empty Beverage Container Reporting and Inspection Program which reduces losses to the BCRF from inappropriate redemptions.
- 10 positions and \$945,000 BCRF to continue on-site oversight activities at certified processor facilities.

Engineering Support Workload—It is requested that Item 3970-001-0387 be increased by \$1,013,000 for two years, to address engineering support workload that was deferred while the Department responded to various emergency fire debris cleanup projects as a result of the Butte and Valley fires. This funding would help complete deferred technical reports and workload such as closure maintenance plans, post closure maintenance plans, corrective action plans, and waste management site remediation.
