Amendment to Various Budget Bill Items, Support, Local Assistance, and Capital Outlay, California Transportation Agency, Department of Transportation, and Shared Revenues

Withdraw the Governor's Proposed Transportation Package—It is requested that various Budget Bill items be decreased by \$1,300,672,000 to reflect the passage of the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017 (SB 1). The provisions included in the Governor's Budget were negotiated and a collaborative plan was subsequently agreed upon through the passage of SB 1.

It is further requested that the following items be decreased to conform to this action:

- Decrease Item 2660-001-0042 by \$120,000,000

The above amendments represent a full withdrawal of the Governor's January transportation proposal while retaining requests for the California Transportation Commission's \$216,000 for 2 positions for review and oversight of SB 1 programs and the State Controller's Office's \$112,000 and 1 position for collection and allocation of SB 1 revenues. Both of these requests are funded from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account, State Transportation Fund.

Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017—The Department of Transportation (Caltrans) requests that various Budget Bill items be added and amended to reflect funding available from the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017 (SB 1). It is also requested that the Capital Outlay Support (COS) program be adjusted to represent the baseline project funding level prior to SB 1 implementation.

Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account Administration

Road Repair and Accountability Act–Workload (Issue 404)—It is requested that Item 2740-001-3290 be added in the amount of \$3,760,000 (see Attachment 17) to provide resources for the Department of Motor Vehicles to address increased credit card transaction costs resulting from the new Transportation Improvement Fee created by SB 1.

COS Program-Baseline Adjustment

Road Repair and Accountability Act–Workload (Issue 454)—It is requested that the COS program be decreased by \$29,329,000 and 243 positions. This request reflects decreased and reallocation of workload due to diminishing fund sources, such as the depletion of Proposition 1B and lower fuel excise taxes associated with increased vehicle fuel efficiency. While passage of SB 1 addresses the funding shortfall, this request represents the baseline workload to begin in 2017-18, and does not include new resources associated with SB 1.

The personal services budget reduction within each fund type varies based on actual salary rates of the classifications performing the work. The COS program is decreasing by 161 federally funded positions, but total federal personal services authority is increasing by \$9,625,000. This is because federal salary rates have increased by \$8,911 per position from 2016-17 to 2017-18. Conversely, the State Highway Account, State Transportation Fund is increasing by 6 positions, but due to actual salary rates decreasing by \$7,631 per position, personal services are decreasing by \$25,781,000. Overall the COS program is reducing personal services budget by \$29,693,000 based on the reduction of 243 positions, but the breakdown by fund type varies based on the workload salary rates within each fund type.

The other adjustment that significantly impacts COS baseline funding for fiscal year 2016-17 is the allocation of the Indirect Cost Rate. The rate is used to determine the amount of internal costs to be recovered through capital outlay project costs associated with direct project labor. The rate is forecast to decline by approximately 12 percent from 2016-17 (50.4 percent) to 2017-18 (38.4 percent) due to reduced overhead costs. The indirect rate is applied to personal services expenditures for non-State Highway Account, State Transportation Fund expenditures. The rate change results in a reallocation of overall authority across all COS funds.

The Office of the Inspector General—It is requested that Item 2660-001-0042 be increased by \$9,467,000 and 58 positions. The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (SB 1) creates the Office of Inspector General to provide review and oversite of new and existing transportation programs. The Inspector General shall report to the Governor, the Legislature, and the California Transportation Commission with a summary of his or her investigations, audit findings, and recommendations.

The creation of the Office includes the redirection of \$8,752,000 and 48 positions from the Division of Audits and the addition of 10 new positions. The net overall change for all funds in the Department's budget is an increase of \$715,000 and 10 positions. The request includes changes to the following items:

Amendment to and Addition of Various Budget Bill Items, Support and Capital Outlay, Various Departments

Motor Voter Implementation—It is requested that Item 2740-001-0001 be added in the amount of \$1,750,000 and Item 2740-001-0044 be increased by \$5,249,000 to provide resources for the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to address programming and ongoing workload needs associated with Chapter 729, Statutes of 2015. This Chapter requires DMV to create an opt-out system for voter registration for all eligible driver license or identification card applicants. These funds will be used to develop an electronic form for driver license or identification card applications, which will create an automatic method of capturing the voter registration information of applicants.

Federal Driver License and Identification Card Conformity—It is requested that Item 2740-001-0044 be increased by \$22,968,000 to address workload requirements associated with conforming to federal requirements for driver licenses and identification cards. These funds will be used to address increases in workload associated with providing driver licenses and identification cards that meet federal minimum standards for identity verification. It is further requested that trailer bill language be added to facilitate the state's compliance with the federal requirements (see Attachment 1).

California Highway Patrol (CHP) and DMV Capital Outlay—It is requested that Item 2720-301-0044 be decreased by \$300,000 and Item 2740-301-0044 be decreased by \$450,000 to adjust each department's Statewide Planning and Site Identification appropriation. As these funds are used to determine the capital project proposals to be pursued in the future, these adjustments would result in one fewer replacement project request for both the CHP and DMV in fiscal year 2019-20. The remaining authority would be used to identify two future CHP replacement projects and to plan up to three future DMV reconfiguration projects. It is further requested that Provisions 1 and 2 of Item 2740-301-0044 be eliminated to correspond to this decrease (see Attachment 2). The decreases are consistent with the reduction in future capital outlay proposals necessary to ensure a sufficient balance in the Motor Vehicle Account, State Transportation Fund.

Front End Applications Sustainability Project—It is requested that provisional language be added to Item 2740-001-0044 to allow the Director of Finance to provide funding for DMV planning activities related to the Front End Applications Sustainability Project (see Attachment 3). This funding will allow DMV to engage in planning activities to prepare for a multi-year incremental technology upgrade project to replace DMV's aging systems.

Add the following trailer bill language:

Section 12800.7 of the Vehicle Code is amended to read:

- **12800.7.** (a) Upon application for an original, or renewal, or duplicate license the department may require the applicant to produce any identification that it determines is necessary in order to ensure that the name of the applicant stated in the application is his or her true, full name and that his or her residence address as set forth in the application is his or her true residence address.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other law, any document provided by the applicant to the department for purposes of proving his or her identity, true, full name, California residency, or that the applicant's presence in the United States is authorized under federal law, is not a public record and may not be disclosed by the department except when requested by a law enforcement agency as part of an investigation.

Vehicle Code Section 12811 is amended as follows:

- **12811.** (a) (1) (A) When the department determines that the applicant is lawfully entitled to a license, it shall issue to the person a driver's license as applied for. The license shall state the class of license for which the licensee has qualified and shall contain the distinguishing number assigned to the applicant, the date of expiration, the true full name, age, and mailing address or residence address of the licensee, a brief description and engraved picture or photograph of the licensee for the purpose of identification, and space for the signature of the licensee.
- (B) Each license shall also contain a space for the endorsement of a record of each suspension or revocation of the license.
- (C) The department shall use whatever process or processes, in the issuance of engraved or colored licenses, that prohibit, as near as possible, the ability to alter or reproduce the license, or prohibit the ability to superimpose a picture or photograph on the license without ready detection.
- (2) In addition to the requirements of paragraph (1), a license issued to a person under 18 years of age shall display the words "provisional until age 18."
- (b) (1) On and after July 1, 2011, an application for an original or renewal driver's license or identification card shall contain a space for the applicant to enroll in the Donate Life California Organ and Tissue Donor Registry. The application shall include check boxes for an applicant to mark either (A) Yes, add my name to the donor registry or (B) I do not wish to register at this time.
- (2) The department shall inquire verbally of an applicant applying in person for an original or renewal driver's license or identification card at a department office as to whether the applicant wishes to enroll in the Donate Life California Organ and Tissue Donor Registry. Failure or refusal to answer this question or check a box on the application form shall not be a basis for the department to deny an applicant a driver's license or identification card.

- (3) The following language shall be included with the question required by paragraph (1):
- "Marking 'Yes' adds your name to the Donate Life California Organ and Tissue Donor Registry and a pink 'donor' dot will appear on your license. If you wish to remove your name from the registry you must contact Donate Life California (see back); DMV can remove the pink dot from your licenses but cannot remove you from the registry."
- (4) The back of the application shall contain the following statement:
- "If, on the front of this form, you marked 'Yes' to register as an organ and tissue donor you are legally authorizing the recovery of organs and tissues in the event of your death. Registering as a donor will not affect your medical treatment in any way. As outlined in the California Anatomical Gift Act, your authorization is legally binding and, unless the donor is under 18 years of age, your decision does not require the consent of any other person. For registered donors under 18 years of age, the legal guardian shall make the final donation decision. You may limit your donation to specific organs or tissues, place usage restrictions, for example transplantation or research, obtain more information about donation, or remove your name from the registry on the Internet Web site of Donate Life California: www.donateLIFEcalifornia.org."
- (5) Notwithstanding any other law, a person under 18 years of age may register as a donor. However, the legal guardian of that person shall make the final decision regarding the donation.
- (6) The department shall collect donor designation information on all applications for an original or renewal driver's license or identification card.
- (7) The department shall print the word "DONOR" or another appropriate designation on the face of a driver's license or identification card to a person who has indicated on the application his or her intent to enroll in the organ donation program pursuant to this section.
- (8) On a weekly basis, the department shall electronically transmit to Donate Life California, a nonprofit organization established and designated as the California Organ and Tissue Donor Registrar pursuant to Section 7150.90 of the Health and Safety Code, all of the following information from every application that indicates the applicant's decision to enroll in the organ donation program:
- (A) His or her true full name.
- (B) His or her residence or mailing address.
- (C) His or her year of birth.
- (D) His or her California driver's license number or identification card number.
- (9) (A) A person who applies for an original or renewal driver's license or identification card may designate a voluntary contribution of two dollars (\$2) for the purpose of promoting and supporting organ and tissue donation. This contribution shall be collected by the department, and treated as a voluntary contribution to Donate Life California and not as a fee for the issuance of a driver's license or identification card.

- (B) The department may use the donations collected pursuant to this paragraph to cover its actual administrative costs incurred pursuant to paragraphs (6) to (8), inclusive. The department shall deposit all revenue derived pursuant to this paragraph and remaining after the department's deduction for administrative costs in the Donate Life California Trust Subaccount, that is hereby created in the Motor Vehicle Account in the State Transportation Fund. Notwithstanding Section 13340 of the Government Code, all revenue in this subaccount is continuously appropriated, without regard to fiscal years, to the Controller for allocation to Donate Life California and shall be expended for the purpose of increasing participation in organ donation programs.
- (C) The department shall transmit to the Donate Life California Organ and Tissue Donor Registry and the appropriate policy and fiscal committees of the Legislature an annual report, and shall make available quarterly updates, detailing funds collected through voluntary contributions as well as a summary of applicants, including all of the following nonidentifiable information:
- (i) Date of application.
- (ii) Method of application (field office, online, or mail).
- (iii) Donor registration status.
- (iv) ZIP Code.
- (v) Gender.
- (vi) Year of birth.
- (D) (i) The annual report to be submitted to the appropriate policy and fiscal committees of the Legislature pursuant to subparagraph (C) shall be submitted in compliance with Section 9795 of the Government Code.
- (ii) Pursuant to Section 10231.5 of the Government Code, the requirement for submitting the annual report to the appropriate policy and fiscal committees of the Legislature imposed under subparagraph (C) is inoperative four years after the date the first annual report is due.
- (10) The enrollment form shall be posted on the Internet Web sites for the department and the California Health and Human Services Agency.
- (11) The enrollment shall constitute a legal document pursuant to the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 7150) of Part 1 of Division 7 of the Health and Safety Code) and shall remain binding after the donor's death despite any express desires of next of kin opposed to the donation. Except as provided in paragraph (5) of subdivision (b), the donation does not require the consent of any other person.
- (12) Donate Life California shall ensure that all additions and deletions to the California Organ and Tissue Donor Registry, established pursuant to Section 7150.90 of the Health and Safety Code, shall occur within 30 days of receipt.

- (13) Information obtained by Donate Life California for the purposes of this subdivision shall be used for these purposes only and shall not be disseminated further by Donate Life California.
- (c) (1) All applications for a driver's license or identification card shall contain a space for an applicant to indicate whether he or she has served in the Armed Forces of the United States and to give his or her consent to be contacted regarding eligibility to receive state or federal veterans benefits. The application shall contain the following statement:

"By marking the veteran box on this application, I certify that I am a veteran of the United States Armed Forces and that I want to receive veterans benefits information from the California Department of Veterans Affairs. By marking the veteran box on this application, I also consent to DMV transmitting my name and mailing address to the California Department of Veterans Affairs for this purpose only, and I certify that I have been notified that this transmittal will occur."

- (2) The department shall collect the information obtained pursuant to paragraph (1).
- (3) As mutually agreed between the department and the Department of Veterans Affairs, the department shall electronically transmit to the Department of Veterans Affairs the following information on each applicant who has identified that he or she has served in the Armed Forces of the United States since the last data transfer and has consented to be contacted about veterans benefits:
- (A) His or her true full name.
- (B) His or her mailing address.
- (4) Information obtained by the Department of Veterans Affairs for the purposes of this subdivision shall be used for the purpose of assisting individuals to access veterans benefits and shall not be disseminated except as needed for this purpose.
- (5) Commencing November 11, 2015, an in-person application for a driver's license or identification card shall allow an applicant to request the word "VETERAN" be printed on the face of the driver's license or identification card. A verification form shall be developed by the Department of Veterans Affairs in consultation with the Department of Motor Vehicles and the California Association of County Veterans Service Officers to acknowledge verification of veteran status. A county veterans service office shall verify the veteran's status as a veteran, sign the verification form, and return it to the veteran. The Department of Motor Vehicles shall accept the signed verification form as proof of veteran status. Upon payment of the fee required pursuant to Section 14901.1, the word "VETERAN" shall be printed on the face of a driver's license or identification card, in a location determined by the department, and issued to a person who makes this request and presents the verification form to the department.
- (d) A public entity or employee shall not be liable for loss, detriment, or injury resulting directly or indirectly from false or inaccurate information contained in the form provided pursuant to subdivision (b).

(e) A contract shall not be awarded to a nongovernmental entity for the processing of driver's licenses, unless the contract conforms to all applicable state contracting laws and all applicable procedures set forth in the State Contracting Manual.

Provisions:

- 1. The Department of Finance may augment the funds in Schedule (1) by up to \$1,000,000 for the purpose of securing option agreements to purchase critical parcels of real property. Any augmentation may be authorized not sooner than 30 days after notification is provided to the chairpersons of the committees in each house of the Legislature that consider appropriations, the chairpersons of the committees and the appropriate subcommittees in each house of the Legislature that consider the Department of Motor Vehicles budget, and the Chairperson of the Joint Legislative Budget Committee, or not sooner than whatever lesser time the chairperson of the joint committee, or his or her designee, may in each instance determine. Any such option agreement is subject to Property Acquisition Law.
- On or before January 31, 2018, and before the submission of a 30-day notice described in Provision 1, the Department of Finance shall report to the appropriate fiscal committees of the Legislature and the Legislative Analyst's Office on the status of the 2017–18 Statewide Planning and Site Identification appropriation. Specifically, the report shall (a) identify the communities in which a search for land for a potential Department of Motor Vehicles office replacement is ongoing and (b) describe the deficiencies of the Department of Motor Vehicles office in each selected community.

- 3. Neither the State Public Works Board nor the Department of Finance shall be deemed a lead or responsible agency for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (Division 13 (commencing with Section 21000) of the Public Resources Code) for any action, approval, or authorization provided with respect to the activities authorized by this item. This provision does not exempt the Department of Motor Vehicles from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act. This provision is declaratory of existing law.
- 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the funds appropriated in Schedule (6) shall be available for encumbrance until June 30, 2019."

Add the following provision to Item 2740-001-0044:

1. The Director of Finance may augment this item by \$3,414,000 to provide funding for planning activities related to the Front End Applications Sustainability Project. This augmentation may not occur until the Department of Motor Vehicles has either gained concurrence from the Department of Technology that it has sufficient availability of program and information technology staff necessary to complete the planning efforts, or has completed the following information technology projects: (a) Commercial Driver License Information System, (b) expansion of the automated knowledge test to accommodate additional languages, (c) system updates to conform to federal requirements for issuance of driver licenses and identification cards, and (d) tokenization to increase security for credit card transactions.
