- Comprises about 38% of the total GQ population in California

Civilian Group Quarters

- Covers any new civilian group quarters facilities, facilities that closed, and any facilities that had a change in group quarters population.
- Civilian group quarters include data more efficiently collected by local jurisdictions.
 - Assisted Living Facilities
 - Private College Dormitories
 - o Group Homes
 - Nursing Facilities
 - Residential Treatment Centers


GQ Challenges and Issues

- Prison realignment and county jail enumeration
- College group quarters enumeration
- Military privatization and survey collection
- Administrative record updates for skilled nursing facilities and other GQ

Prison Realignment

- In 2011 Governor Brown signed AB 109 and AB 117
 - o Goal of 137.5% capacity in California state prisons
 - Shifted responsibility of low-level offenders to county jails
- Proposition 47 passed in November 2014
 - Reduces certain drug possession felonies to misdemeanors
 - Requires misdemeanor sentencing for petty theft, receiving stolen property, and forging/writing bad checks when the amount is \$950 or less.
 - Effectively lowered county jail populations throughout the state.

Realignment Results



College GQ Issue

2000 Census Bureau definition of college GQ:

- o "College quarters off campus. Includes university-owned offcampus housing, if the place is reserved exclusively for occupancy by college students who do not have their families living with them. In census products, people in this category are classified as living in a college dormitory."
- "College dormitories. Includes college students in dormitories (provided the dormitory is restricted to students who do not have their families living with them), fraternity and sorority houses, and on-campus residential quarters used exclusively for those in religious orders who are attending college. College dormitory housing includes university-owned, on-campus and off-campus housing for unmarried residents."

College GQ Issue

2010 Census Bureau definition of college GQ:

o "College/University Student Housing (code 501)—
College/University student housing includes residence halls
and dormitories, which house college and university students
in a group living arrangement. These facilities are owned,
leased, or managed either by a college, university, or seminary,
or by a **private entity or organization**. Fraternity and
sorority housing recognized by the college or university are
included as college student housing."

2000 to 2010 College GQ

- No longer mentioned college GQ housing being reserved exclusively for students
- In 2010, student housing may be owned and operated by a private entity and still included
- Unclear if off-campus housing is included in 2010
- No mention of apartments or apartment-style housing

College GQ Issue

- From Census Brochure to UC Berkeley on Group Quarters Enumeration:
 - "Group Quarters are places where people live or stay in group living arrangements that are owned or managed by an entity or organization (such as a college or university) providing housing and/or services for the residents. Off-campus residences where students live are not considered Group Quarters."
