These new standards are designed to reduce emissions of oxides of nitrogen (NOx), particulate matter (PM), and non-methane hydrocarbons (NMHC), improve air quality and safeguard public health. The program remained under subscribed historically in part due to difficulties that applicants have had meeting administrative requirements. This included eligibility requirements as well as the restriction that prevents any HHW from being part of a clean-up grant. Staff proposes broadening the definition of public entity to expand the type of applicants allowed and also to provide alternative affidavits for proof that the owner of the land was not the source of illegal dumping. Staff additionally proposes allowing incidental amounts of HHW within the clean-up activities.
