Brief summary of the proposed regulation (1 paragraph or less): Staff will present for Board consideration proposed amendments to the existing regulations that require emission reductions from auxiliary engines for ocean-going vessels while at-berth. These amendments will address specific compliance challenges, clarify regulatory language, and increase existing emission reduction requirements. In addition, these amendments, based on the public health need and feasibility, aim to expand the At-Berth Regulation to include smaller fleets, additional ports and vessel types, and/or more vessel emissions sources (such as boilers on oil tankers). The amendments will propose to place responsibility on all parties needed for success, beyond vessel fleets. The changes may have impacts on existing infrastructure and equipment needs to comply with the regulation due to the potential for additional regulated parties. This is the first of two hearings and the second hearing will take place in 2019. <p><b>Brief summary of the proposed regulation (1 paragraph or less):</b></p> <p>In September 2016 Governor Brown signed SB 1383 (Lara, Chapter 395, Statutes of 2016), establishing methane emissions reduction targets in a statewide effort to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants in various sectors of California's economy. As it pertains to CalRecycle, SB 1383 establishes targets to achieve a 50 percent reduction in the level of the statewide disposal of organic waste from the 2014 level by 2020, and a 75 percent reduction by 2025. The bill also establishes a target to reduce the disposal of edible food that is currently disposed by 20 percent by 2025. The bill directs CalRecycle to adopt regulations to achieve these statewide disposal reduction and edible food recovery targets. Accordingly, CalRecycle (in consultation with the California Air Resources Board (CARB), pursuant to the statute) has developed a regulatory approach that requires jurisdictions and other regulated entities to implement a broader and more prescriptive suite of programs in order to achieve the statute's statewide mandates. The regulations include provisions on the following types of activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Collection, with a focus on mandatory source-separated collection of organic materials;</li> <li>• Edible food recovery, with a focus on medium- and large-sized generators including venues and large events;</li> <li>• Solid waste facilities, including recovery standards at mixed waste processing facilities and methods for assessing contamination;</li> <li>• Infrastructure planning, with a focus on regional coordination to plan for future composting, anaerobic digestion, and food recovery systems;</li> <li>• Procurement at the local level of compost and renewable natural gas;</li> <li>• Reporting requirements, building on existing systems for reporting to CalRecycle; and</li> <li>• Enforcement, with the primary requirements for mandatory enforcement being placed at the local level but with CalRecycle also having an expanded enforcement role.</li> </ul> <p>The regulation will affect all of the approximately 540 jurisdictions in California ; millions of households; thousands of businesses; hundreds of haulers, food recovery organizations; hundreds of material recovery facilities, processors, recyclers, landfills; dozens of local government environmental enforcement agencies; all schools, federal and state agencies, and some end users of recycled organic products.</p>

<p>Brief summary of the proposed regulation (1 paragraph or less):</p> <p>Updating California Code of Regulations (CCR) is a proposed policy change that ELAP is promulgating, as recommended by an Expert Review Panel. The Panel determined the root cause of ELAP's problems was the inadequate language codified in CCR resulting in inconsistencies in program implementation and lack of a systematic approach for determining the competency of laboratories that are seeking or maintaining accreditation. The proposed Laboratory Standard includes the NELAC Institute (TNI) Standard (2016) is incorporated by reference. Upon adoption of proposed regulations, staff propose 3 year delayed compliance. There are solely two modifications to the TNI Standard: 1) Personnel Qualifications and 2) Proficiency Testing (PT) frequency (1 PT per method requested for accreditation). Enforcement unit will have a criteria included for a process to deny, suspend, or revoke accreditation. There will be an introduction of monetary fines for late submittal of applications. The application/billing process will be streamline by requiring all applications submitted on the same day. Monitoring Proficiency Testing requirements will be more stringent to ensure laboratory staff are capable of running analytical methods. A new regulated category will be mobile laboratories, which will be regulated as an independent entity and no longer an extension of a stationary laboratory. For technical work, specific analytical test methods will be removed from the regulations to provide ELAP the flexibility to provide current, relevant methods that laboratories and State Agency Partners need to adequately protect California's health and environment without having to amend the regulations.</p>	Contact Person: <b>Jacob Oaxaca</b>
