Section 11.90—Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Funding to Cities and Counties

Pursuant to Section 11.90 of the 2020 Budget Act, the following report is respectfully submitted.

The Department of Finance requests to allocate \$1,789,065,000 from the state's share of the Coronavirus Relief Fund to cities and counties for homelessness, public health, public safety, and other services to combat the COVID-19 pandemic.

Section 11.90 of the 2020 Budget Act provides for the expenditure of \$9,525,564,744 in federal funds allocated from the Coronavirus Relief Fund in the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to support the state's response to the COVID-19 public health emergency. Of these funds, \$1,289,065,000 is to be allocated to counties, and \$500,000,000 is to be allocated to cities (allocation schedule attached). Receipt of funding is contingent on adherence to federal guidance, the state's stay-at-home and other health requirements as directed in executive orders, statutes, and all State Department of Public Health orders, directives, and guidance issued in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The funds will be remitted in phases, with the first allocations each consisting of one-sixth of the total amounts available to each entity. Those allocations will be remitted by approximately August 1, 2020, September 1, 2020, and the remainder will be allocated in October 2020.
