Brief summary of the proposed regulation (1 paragraph or less): Given that buildings are responsible for a significant portion of statewide greenhouse gas emissions and fossil gas use in buildings alone contributes to about 10% of greenhouse gas emissions and 5% of statewide NOx emissions, zero-emission appliance standards provide an opportunity for substantial emission reductions from buildings to help meet climate and air quality targets. The basic concept would require new sales of space and water heaters for residential and commercial buildings to be zero-emission starting in 2030. This would apply to sales for new construction or to replace units in existing buildings. The standard would allow the continued use and repair of existing gas appliances. The primary goal of this regulation is to reduce emissions from new space and water heaters sold in California since space and water heating comprise nearly 90 percent of all building-related fossil gas demand. Code, § 26202.) The proposed regulations implement SB 2 by: -establishing the qualifications necessary to become a CCW DOJ Certified Instructor; -establishing the grounds for revoking a CCW DOJ Certified Instructor's certification; -establishing the process for the CCW license applicant's background check so the Department can determine the applicant's eligibility to possess, receive, own, or purchase a firearm; and -providing the manner for a licensing authority to send certain CCW license records to the Department.
