Amendment to Budget Bill Control Sections 4.05 and 4.90

Due to lower revenue projections and a resulting increase in the budget problem, the May Revision proposes adjustments to prior investments to assist in closing the projected shortfall. These adjustments include the following:

Control Section 4.05—It is requested that Control Section 4.05 be amended to allow the Department of Finance to reduce various items of appropriation. Current language in Control Section 4.05 of the 2024 Governor's Budget allows Finance to adjust items of appropriation to reflect net savings achieved through cost-reduction measures. This proposal will allow Finance to adjust additional items of appropriation. Control Section 4.05 is proposed to be amended as follows:

"SEC. 4.05. Notwithstanding any other law, each item of appropriation provided in this act or other spending authority provided outside of this act, with the exception of those for the California State University, the University of California, University of California College of the Law, San Francisco, the Legislature, and the Judicial Branch, shall be adjusted, as appropriate, to reflect the net savings achieved through operational efficiencies and other cost-reduction measures including, but not limited to, reorganizations, eliminations of boards and commissions, rate changes, contract reductions, elimination of excess positions, and the cancellation or postponement of information technology projects. The Director of Finance shall allocate the necessary adjustment to each item of appropriation or other spending authority to reflect savings achieved. The Director of Finance may authorize an augmentation to any item of appropriation provided in this act or outside this act to reflect the costs related to reorganizations, consolidations, or eliminations of agencies, departments, boards, commissions, or programs. The Department of Finance shall make the final determination of the budgetary and accounting transactions to ensure proper implementation of reorganizations and eliminations."

Control Section 4.90—It is requested that Control Section 4.90 be amended to allow Finance to adjust various items of appropriation. The May Revision proposes to revert \$13 million General Fund, and \$9 million Other Funds, from the Architecture Revolving Fund (ARF) back to the original fund source. Current language in Control Section 4.90 of the 2024 Governor's Budget allows Finance to transfer funds from the ARF to the General Fund. This proposal extends Finance's authority to transfer funds from the ARF back to the original fund source. Specifically, Control Section 4.90 is proposed to be amended as follows:

"SEC. 4.90. Notwithstanding any other law, the Department of Finance may transfer any funds previously transferred from the General Fund to the Architecture Revolving Fund back to the General Fund fund source."

Amendment to Budget Bill Control Section 12.00

It is requested that Control Section 12.00 be amended to revise the State Appropriations Limit (SAL). Pursuant to Article XIIIB of the California Constitution, the fiscal year 2024-25 SAL is estimated to be \$147,626,000,000 at May Revision. The revised limit is the result of applying the growth factor of 4.03 percent. The revised 2024-25 limit is \$428 million below the \$148,054,000,000 estimated in January. Control Section 12.00 is proposed to be amended as follows:

"SEC. 12.00. For the purposes of Article XIII B of the California Constitution, there is hereby established a state "appropriations limit" of <u>\$148,054,000,000</u> <u>\$147,626,000,000</u> for the 2024–25 fiscal year.

Any judicial action or proceeding to attack, review, set aside, void, or annul the "appropriations limit" for the 2024–25 fiscal year shall be commenced within 45 days of the effective date of this act."

Amendment to Budget Bill Control Section 12.32

It is requested that Control Section 12.32 be amended as follows to reflect updated calculations at May Revision:

"SEC. 12.32. (a) It is the intent of the Legislature that appropriations that are subject to Section 8 of Article XVI of the California Constitution be designated with the wording "Proposition 98." In the event these appropriations are not so designated, they may be designated as such by the Department of Finance, where that designation is consistent with legislative intent, not less than 30 days after notification in writing of the proposed designation to the chairpersons of the committees in each house of the Legislature that consider appropriations and the Chairperson of the Joint Legislative Budget Committee, or not less than a shorter period after notification that the chairperson of the joint committee, or the chairperson's designee, determines.

(b) Pursuant to the Proposition 98 funding requirements established in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 41200) of Part 24 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Education Code, the total appropriations for Proposition 98 for the 2024–25 fiscal year are <u>\$76,605,857,000</u>\$76,894,327,000, or <u>39.2839.45</u> percent of total General Fund revenues, Education Protection Account revenues, and transfers subject to the state appropriations limit. General Fund and Education Protection Account revenues appropriated for school districts are <u>\$67,528,167,000</u>\$67,347,498,000, or <u>34.63</u>34.55 percent of total General Fund revenues, Education Protection Account revenues, and transfers subject to the state appropriated to school districts and Education Protection Account revenues appropriated to school districts and community college districts for adult education and K–12 Career Technical Education Strong Workforce Program are <u>\$832,020,000</u>\$830,016,000, or 0.43 percent of total General Fund revenues, Education Protection Account revenues, and transfers subject to the state appropriations limit. General Fund and Education Protection Account revenues appropriated for community college districts are <u>\$7,513,054,000</u>\$7,372,568,000, or <u>3.853.78</u> percent of total General Fund revenues, Education Protection Account revenues, and transfers subject to the state appropriations limit. General Fund and Education Protection Account revenues appropriated for other state agencies that provide direct elementary and secondary level education, as defined in Section 41302.5 of the Education Code, are <u>\$732,616,000</u>\$592,967,000, or <u>0.380.30</u> percent of total General Fund revenues, Education Protection Account revenues, and transfers subject to the state appropriations limit. <u>No</u> General Fund and Education Protection Account revenues <u>are scheduled to be</u> transferred to the Public School System Stabilization Account <u>for the 2024-25 fiscal year</u>. are \$751,278,000, or 0.39 percent of total General Fund revenues, Education Protection Account revenues, and transfers subject to the state appropriations limit.

(c) Notwithstanding any preexisting budgetary or accounting requirements to the contrary, the Department of Finance shall make the final determination of the proper budgeting and accounting of the revenues received by, and disbursements from, the Education Protection Account."

Amendment to Control Section 13.40

Control Section 13.40: Budgetary Loan Borrowing from Special Funds—It is requested that Control Section 13.40 be amended to reflect a decrease in the allowable amount of special funds that may be transferred to the General Fund from \$738,900,000 to \$465,900,000 during the fiscal year 2024-25. For the loans included in that amount, some have changed in value since the Governor's Budget proposal or will utilize a different budget bill authority.

The specific amendment is proposed in the following language:

"SEC. 13.40. The Director of Finance may collectively transfer \$738,900,000 <u>\$465,900,000</u> from various special funds to the General Fund as budgetary loans during the 2024–25 fiscal year. The specific special funds to borrow from will only be from idle resources not required for currently projected operational or programmatic purposes. The loans will be repaid in a future year when the fund or account from which the loan was made has a need for the moneys or there is no longer a need for the moneys in the General Fund."

Amendment to Budget Bill Control Section 35.50

It is requested that Control Section 35.50 be amended as follows to reflect updated calculations at May Revision.

"SEC. 35.50. (a) For purposes of paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 10, and subdivision (g) of Section 12, of Article IV of the California Constitution, "General Fund revenues" means the total resources available to the General Fund for a fiscal year before any transfer to or withdrawal from the Budget Stabilization Account.

(b) For purposes of subdivision (g) of Section 12 of Article IV of the California Constitution, the estimate of General Fund revenues for the 2024–25 fiscal year pursuant to this act, as passed by the Legislature, is \$210,702,000,000 \$211,849,000,000.

(c) For purposes of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, "General Fund revenues" shall be defined as revenues and transfers before any transfer to or withdrawal from the Budget Stabilization Account.

(d) Pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the following estimates are provided:

(1) For purposes of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the sum equal to 1.5 percent of General Fund revenues for the 2024–25 fiscal year is \$2,964,000,000 \$2,989,000,000.

(2) For purposes of clause (ii) of subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, capital gain revenues that exceed 8 percent of General Fund proceeds of taxes for the 2024–25 fiscal year is \$1,978,000,000 \$392,000,000.

(3) For purposes of clause (ii) of subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (c) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the amount for debt payments in the 2024–25 fiscal year is \$1,616,000,000.

(3)(4) For purposes of subparagraph (F) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the amount of transfer to the Budget Stabilization Account in the 2024–25 fiscal year is \$2,096,000,000 \$1,616,000,000.

(4)(5) Notwithstanding paragraph (3) of subdivision (d) of this section, pursuant to paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) of Section 22 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the transfer to the Budget Stabilization Account for the 2024–25 fiscal year in the amount of $\frac{22,096,000,000}{1,616,000,000}$ is suspended.

(5)(6) For purposes of clause (ii) of subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the updated estimate of capital gain revenues that exceeds 8 percent of General Fund proceeds of taxes for the 2023–24 fiscal year is \$756,000,000 <u>\$0</u>.

(6) (7) For purposes of subparagraph (G) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the first true up of the transfer to the Budget Stabilization Account for the 2023–24 fiscal year is $\frac{1,424,000,000}{8847,000,000}$.

(7)(8) For purposes of clause (ii) of subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the updated capital gain revenues that exceed 8 percent of General Fund proceeds of taxes for the 2022–23 fiscal year is \$889,000,000 \$714,000,000.

(8)(9) For purposes of subparagraph (G) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 20 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, the second true up of the transfer to the Budget Stabilization Account for the 2022–23 fiscal year is a reduction of \$544,000,000.

(9)(10) Pursuant to subparagraph (A) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 22 of Article XVI of the California Constitution, <u>\$12,026,000,000</u> <u>\$3,126,000,000</u> is hereby transferred from the Budget Stabilization Account to the General Fund for the 2024–25 fiscal year effective July 1, 2024.
