## Boundary and Annexation Survey Boundary Validation Program

- 2020 BAS Approaching in January
  - BAS Contacts
- 2020 BVP Happens Concurrently
  - Once a decade
  - Highest Elected Official
- Last Chance for Changes to be Reflected in 2020 Census Statistics

Important BAS/BVP Dates	
January 1, 2020	Legal boundaries as of this date can be included
January 2020	BAS Mailing Initial BVP Mailing
March 1, 2020	BAS Updates by this date will be eligible for BVP early (in time for 2020 Census)
May 31, 2020	BAS Updates by this date will be reflected in the 2020 Census
June 2020	Final BVP materials mailed
July 2020	Final BVP responses due

## Type of Enumeration Area (TEA)

### ➤ Two Types of Enumeration in California

- TEA 1 – Self Response
- TEA 6 – Update Leave
- Blocks with no residential addresses on file were assigned to TEA 1
- Non-Responders in both types will be included in the Non-Response Follow-Up Operation (NRFU)

### ➤ All TEAs Are Now Final

- TEA 5 – Military is gone
- Selected areas impacted by last year's Camp and Carr fires were changed from TEA 1 to TEA 6

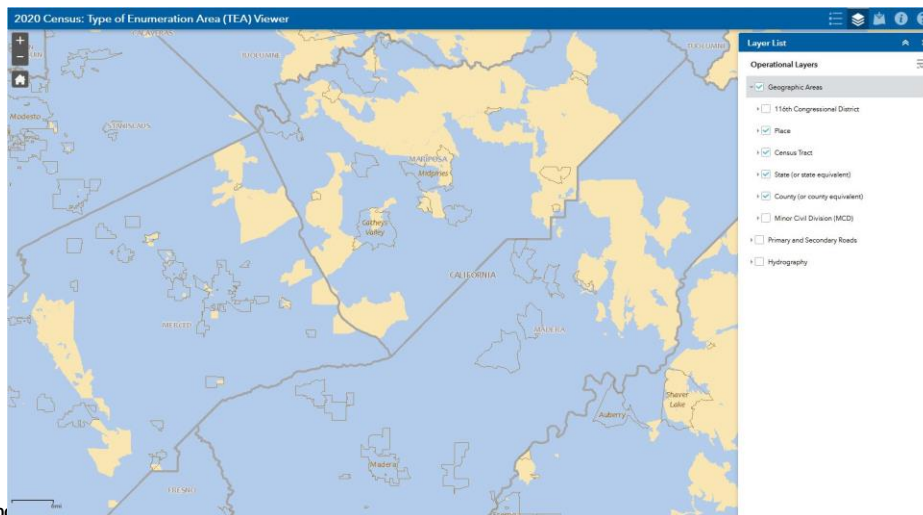

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## Address Canvassing

### ➤ In-Office Address Canvassing

- Used aerial imagery to compare housing over time
- Compare to Master Address File

### ➤ In-Field Address Canvassing

- Blocks that couldn't be resolved using In-Office Address Canvassing process
- Approximately 30% of Census Blocks
- First field operation of 2020 Census
- Operation is now complete
- Deleted addresses will still be included in initial mailing

**2020 Census: In-Field Address Canvassing (IFAC) Viewer**

**Information**

This viewer was developed to allow users to explore the In-Field Address Canvassing (IFAC) workload areas. Users can see the percentage of basic collection units (BCUs) and housing units (HUs) in the Self-Response Type of Enumeration Areas (TEA 1) by clicking on a County, Census Tract, or Congressional District. Learn how to interact with this tool by clicking the Application Help icon in the toolbar above.

The In-Field Address Canvassing workload areas are shown in green on the map.

The Address Canvassing operation serves two purposes:

- Deliver a complete and accurate address list and spatial database for enumeration.
- Determine the type and address characteristics for each living quarter.

Specifically, this operation implements both in-office and in-field methods to maintain and update the United States Census Bureau's address list in advance of the 2020 Census enumeration. The Census Bureau needs the address and physical location of each living quarter in the United States and Puerto Rico to conduct and tabulate the census. An accurate list ensures that residents will be invited to participate in the census and that the census counts residents in the correct location.

**How we determined where the fieldwork should occur:**

In-Office Address Canvassing utilized imagery to detect housing change or stability over time throughout the United States and Puerto Rico and to compare the number of housing units on the ground to the number in the Census Bureau's Master Address File. In-Office Address

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## What is a **GROUP QUARTER (GQ)**?

- A GQ is a place where people who are usually not related live or stay in a group living arrangement owned or managed by an entity or organization providing housing and/or services for the residents.
- These services may include custodial or medical care as well as other types of assistance.
- Residency is commonly restricted to those receiving services.



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## Types of Groups Quarters

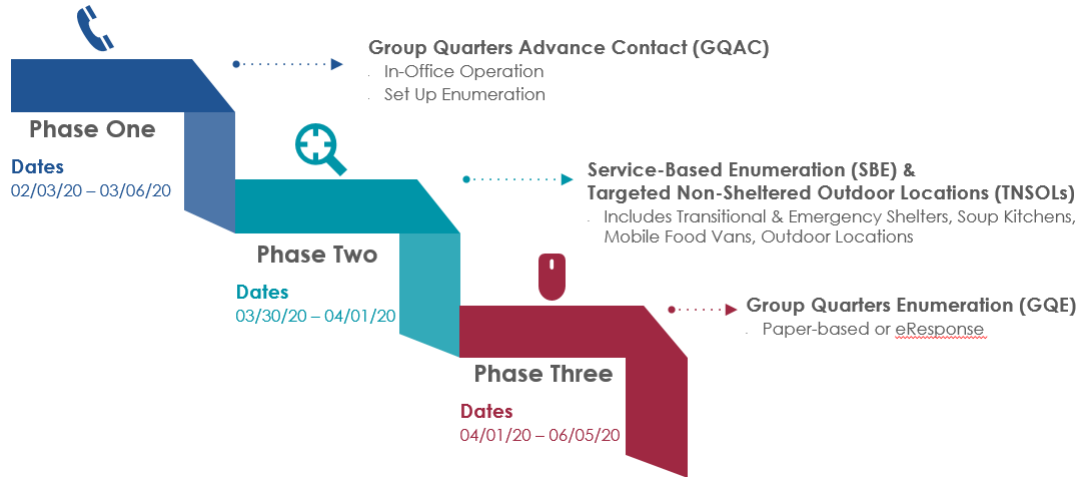
- **Group homes**
- **Nursing facilities/skilled nursing facilities (nursing homes)**
- **Residential treatment facilities**
- **College/university or seminary student housing**
  - E.g. residence halls or other buildings including apartment-style housing where residents enter into "by the bed" leases, and fraternity or sorority houses recognized by the college or university
- **Religious group living quarters**
  - E.g. convents, monasteries, and abbeys
- **Correctional facilities**
- **In-patient hospice facilities**
- **Hospitals**
- **Workers' group living quarters**
- **Job Corps centers or vocational training facilities**
- **Service-Based Group Quarters:**
  - Soup Kitchens
  - Emergency and Transitional Shelters for people experiencing homelessness
  - Regularly Scheduled Mobile Food Vans
  - Targeted Non-Sheltered Outdoor Locations
