Brief summary of the proposed regulation (1 paragraph or less): <b>Staff will present for Board consideration amendments to the chrome plating ATCM to further reduce hexavalent chromium emissions from chrome plating facilities. This proposal may include requirements to transition hexavalent chromium to a lesser toxic trivalent chrome option. The primary changes we are proposing are to require the use of trivalent chromium technologies where feasible, require additional control options for non-plating tanks, and require control options for building enclosures and add-on controls. Brief summary of the proposed regulation (1 paragraph or less):  Currently, heavy-duty vehicles with gross vehicle weight ratings (GVWR) greater than 14,000 pounds operating in California are subject to smoke opacity testing through the Heavy-Duty Vehicle Inspection Program and the Periodic Smoke Inspection Program. However, there is no systematic way to ensure that all heavy-duty vehicles operating in California have properly functioning emissions-related control components and systems for the duration of their on-road operations. Senate Bill 210, signed into law in 2019, directs CARB and its sister agencies to establish a more comprehensive HD I/M program that effectively ensures all emissions control components are operating as designed. The proposed HD I/M program would apply to all diesel and natural gas vehicles over 14,000 pounds GVWR that operate in California. Staff is considering requiring periodic on-board diagnostic (OBD) testing on applicable heavy-duty vehicles and establishing a statewide roadside remote sensing network to identify high emitting heavy-duty vehicles. For in-state heavy-duty vehicles, their vehicle registration renewals would be tied to compliance with the HD I/M program, similar to what is done now under the current Smog Check program for light-duty vehicles. To ensure a level playing field for all vehicles operating in California and to achieve maximum air quality benefits throughout the state, out-of-state vehicles operating in California would also have to demonstrate compliance with HD I/M program requirements. The roadside remote sensing network coupled with enhanced roadside enforcement efforts would help aid efforts to hold out-of-state vehicles accountable to the same standards that in-state vehicles must meet. The proposed amendments will include more stringent exhaust and evaporative emissions standards, new procedures for measuring emissions, increased durability requirements for emissions control systems, on-board diagnostic requirements to monitor the performance of emissions control systems, a mandate to increase zero-emissions motorcycle sales gradually over time, and a zero emissions credit program to provide manufacturers with flexibility in meeting the zero emissions sales requirements. The proposed regulatory requirements would begin in model year 2024 by harmonizing with more stringent exhaust standards that are already effective in Europe.
