7 8	§18959. Purpose.
9	
10	The purpose of this Article is to clarify existing statute and establish administrative
11	procedures to efficiently and effectively implement the department's responsibilities
12	under the law and to provide a uniform competitive business environment to all mattress
13	manufacturers, renovators, distributors, recyclers, and retailers pursuant to Chapter 21
14	(commencing with section 42985), Part 3, Division 30 of the Public Resources Code.

22	§18960. Definitions.
23	
24	(a) Except as otherwise noted, the definitions of this Article supplement and are
25	governed by the definitions set forth in Chapter 21 (commencing with section 42985),
26	Part 3, Division 30 of the Public Resources Code:

1	(b) "Brand" means a name, term, symbol, design, type, Universal Registry Number		
2	(URN) or any other feature that attributes a mattress to the manufacturer or renovator o		
3	such mattress.		
4	(c) "Collection" means any method by which a service provider receives used		
5	mattresses from a program participant.		
6	(d) "Operational costs" means costs to operate a mattress recycling organization's		
7	mattress recycling program, including, but not limited to, collection, transportation,		
8	processing, disposal, and education and outreach costs.		
9	(e) "Significant or material change" includes a change in a required element of the		
10	used mattress recovery and recycling plan that affects the organization's costs or		
11	revenues, such as a change that results in a modification of the recycling charge, a		
12	change that requires a party other than the mattress recycling organization to make a		
13	major change in how it participates in the program, or a change that reduces the goals		
14	set for the organization in the existing approved recycling plan.

24	(a) A corporate officer, acting on behalf of a mattress recycling organization, shall		
25	submit as part of the used mattress recovery and recycling plan (plan) the following		
26	information:		
27	(1) Contact information of the corporate officer responsible for submitting the		
28	plan to the department and for overseeing used mattress recycling program		
29	activities, including, but not limited to:		
30	(A) Contact name		
31	(B) Title		

1	(C) Name of mattress recycling organization
2	(D) Mailing address
3	(E) Phone number
4	(F) E-mail address
5	(G) Web address, if applicable
6	(2) List contact information for each manufacturer, renovator, and retailer the
7	mattress recycling organization is composed of, including, but not limited to:
8	(A) Name of Company
9	(B) Mailing or corporate address
10	(C) Upon request by the department, the following information shall be
11	provided, if available: individual Web address, contact name, title, phone
12	number, and e-mail address of participating manufacturers, renovators,
13	and retailers. The requested information shall be submitted within 30
14	days of the request unless extended as determined by the department.
15	(3) List of brands covered under the plan.
16	(4) Any changes to the information in subsections (1), (2), and (3) of subdivision
17	(a) of this section shall be submitted to the department quarterly, or more
18	frequently as the mattress recycling organization desires, according to
19	instructions provided by the department.
20	(b) The plan may be submitted electronically according to instructions provided by the
21	department. If the plan is submitted electronically, the date of electronic submittal will be
22	considered the date of receipt by the department, provided that the organization also
23	submits to the department a hard copy submittal letter referencing the plan electronic
24	document with the signature of a corporate officer of a mattress recycling organization.

4	below ar	nd contain the following:
5	<u>(1)</u>	Proof of Certification.
6	<u>(2)</u>	Program Goals, Methods, and Activities. Identify program objectives
7		consistent with California's solid waste management hierarchy as required by
8		subdivision (a) of section 42987.1 of the Public Resources Code. Describe
9		how the program will meet the requirements of subdivisions (d), (g), (i), (j), (k),
10		(I), (m), (o), and (p) of section 42987.1 of the Public Resources Code. For
11		plans submitted after January 1, 2018, identify objectives and activities that
12		will comply with the state mattress recycling goals, pursuant to section

8 (c) The department shall determine if the plan is complete and notify the submitting

9 mattress recycling organization within 30 days of receipt of the plan. If the department

10 finds that the plan is complete, the department's 90-day review period for consideration

of approval of the plan, set forth in section 42987.3 of the Public Resources Code, will

12 commence upon the original date of receipt. If the plan is incomplete, the department

13 shall identify what additional information shall be submitted to make it complete and the

14 plan shall be resubmitted within not less than 30 days or as determined by the director.

15 If the department determines upon resubmittal that the plan is complete, the

department's 90-day review period for consideration of approval of the plan will

commence upon the original date of receipt of the resubmittal.

18 (d) If the department conditionally approves a plan, the department shall identify the

deficiencies in the plan and the mattress recycling organization shall comply with the

20 conditions of approval within not less than 60 days or as determined by the director of

the notice date. If the conditions are met, the department shall approve the plan.

(e) If the department conditionally approves a plan and the conditions are not met, the
 department shall disapprove the plan.

(f) If the department disapproves a plan, the department shall identify the deficiencies
 in the plan and the mattress recycling organization shall resubmit a plan or provide
 supplemental information requested within not less than 60 days of the notice date or as
 determined by the director.

(g) The mattress recycling plan shall be submitted for re-approval upon any significant
 or material change, as defined. The department shall review the revised plan within 90
 days of receipt. The department may approve, disapprove, or conditionally approve the
 revised plan. The department may also require the mattress recycling organization to

 as defined.

A corporate officer, acting on behalf of a mattress recycling organization, shall 10 (a) submit a used mattress recycling program budget on or before July 1, 2015, and 11 12 on or before July 1 annually thereafter. The annual budget may be submitted electronically according to instructions provided by the department. If the annual 13 budget is submitted electronically, the date of electronic submittal will be 14 considered the date of receipt by the department, provided that the organization 15 16 also submits to the department a hard copy submittal letter referencing the annual budget electronic document with the signature of a corporate officer of a mattress 17 18 recycling organization.

- (b) In addition to the requirements of subdivisions (a), (b), and (c) of section 42988 of
 the Public Resources Code, the information submitted in the used mattress
 recycling program budget shall contain the following:
- (1) Contact information. Identify the corporate officer of the mattress recycling
 organization responsible for annual used mattress program budget submittal.
- (2) Anticipated revenues and costs. Describe anticipated revenues and costs of
 implementing the program, including related programs, projects, contracts,
 and administrative expenses.
- (3) Mattress recycling charge and itemization. Identify the amount of the mattress
 recycling charge, including an itemization of costs that each charge covers.
- (4) For used mattress recycling program budgets submitted July 1, 2017 all
 actual expenses incurred to date shall be included. For annual reports
 submitted thereafter, previous two years of actual expenses shall be included.

11	instructio	ons provided by the department. If the annual report is submitted electronically,
12	the date	of electronic submittal will be considered the date of receipt by the department,
13	provided	that the organization also submits to the department a hard copy submittal
14	letter ref	erencing the annual report electronic document with the signature of a
15	corporat	e officer of a mattress recycling organization.
16	<u>(b)</u> The	e annual report shall follow the outline below and contain the following:

19	<u>(2)</u>	Executive Summary. The purpose of the Executive Summary is to provide a
20		broad understanding of the mattress recycling organization's program as a
21		whole and to put into context the data and information that will follow. Provide
22		a brief description of the mattress recycling organization's used mattress
23		recovery efforts during the reporting period pursuant to section 18962.
24	<u>(3)</u>	A description of the methods used to collect, transport, and process used
25		mattresses in California.
26	<u>(4)</u>	Include an updated list of participating manufacturers, renovators, and
27		retailers and any updates to their respective contact information per section
28		18961(a)(2) and an updated list of brands covered under the plan per section
29		18961(a)(3).

1	(5) Description of how consumers of mattresses in California had an opportunity
2	to recycle and properly manage their used mattresses, including the number,
3	location, and type of collection points in the program.
4	(6) May include a description of activities followed by program participants to
5	ensure proper collection and management of used mattresses.
6	(7) A description of methods used by the mattress recycling organization to
7	coordinate with existing used mattress collection and recycling programs with

17	(a) An annual report shall be submitted to the department and the mattress recycling
18	organization by a person that is engaged in business as a used mattress renovator. The
19	annual report may be submitted electronically according to instructions provided by the
20	department. A hard copy, signed by a corporate officer of a mattress recycler shall be
21	submitted to the department upon request.
22	(b) The annual report shall contain the following:
23	(1) Contact information. Identify the corporate officer of the mattress renovator
24	responsible for annual report submittal.
25	(2) Quantitative information on the number of used mattresses received from
26	California sources and out of state sources and renovated in the state during
27	the preceding calendar year. Conversion factor(s), if used, shall also be
28	provided.
29	(3) Quantitative information on the number of used mattresses generated in
30	California and sent out of state for renovation or other method of disposition.

1	(4) Other information deemed necessary by the department that is reasonably
2	related to compliance with this chapter and that can be reasonably compiled.
3

7	§18967. Solid Waste Facility Annual Report.
8	
9	(a) An annual report shall be submitted by a person that is engaged in business as an
10	operator of a solid waste facility to the department and the mattress recycling
11	organization. The annual report may be submitted electronically according to
12	instructions provided by the department. A hard copy, signed by a designated
13	representative of a solid waste facility shall be submitted to the department upon
14	request.
15	(b) The annual report shall contain the following:
16	(1) Contact information. Identify the designated representative of the solid waste
17	facility responsible for annual report submittal.
18	(2) The number of used mattresses disposed of at the site in the preceding
19	calendar year and the number of mattresses the facility recycled, renovated, or
20	sent away to be recycled or renovated in the preceding calendar year. Facility
21	operators are required to count, track, and report on each mattress they
22	observed during the normal operation of the facility. Facility operators are not
23	required to do additional sorting or processing to find a mattress that was an
24	incidental part of a load, or that could not be counted or observed upon receipt.

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1	§18968. Mattress Recycling Organization Advisory Committee Annual Report.

3	(a) An annual report shall be submitted by a designee of the mattress recycling
4	organization advisory committee, established pursuant to subsection (3) of subdivision
5	(a) of section 42987 of the Public Resources Code to the mattress recycling
6	organization no later than 30 days prior to when the annual report is due to the
7	department. The annual report may be submitted electronically according to instructions
8	provided by the department. A hard copy, signed by a designated representative of the
9	advisory committee shall be submitted to the mattress recycling organization.
10	(b) The annual report shall contain the following:
11	(1) Contact information. Identify the designated representative of the advisory
12	committee responsible for annual report submittal and each member of the
13	advisory committee, including member name and company/affiliation.
14	(2) A summary of the consultative process between the advisory committee and
15	the mattress recycling organization relating to the ongoing implementation of
16	the plan, as well as any other information deemed pertinent by the advisory
17	committee to maximize the recovery and recycling of used mattresses in the
18	state, per subdivision (k) of section 42990.1 the Public Resources Code.

24	
25	Each mattress recycling organization, manufacturer, renovator, retailer, recycler, and
26	distributor required to comply with Chapter 21 (commencing with section 42985), Part 3,
27	Division 30 of the Public Resources Code shall:
28	(a) Maintain records to support the requirements in this Article.
29	(1) Mattress recycling organizations shall maintain records to support section
30	18962.

1	(2) Retailers, renovators, recyclers and distributors shall provide access to existing
2	records on all mattresses sold or offered for sale in the state including:
3	(A) The manufacturer of the mattress.
4	(B) The date(s) the retailer purchased the mattress from the manufacturer.
5	(C) The date(s) the retailer sold the mattress.
6	(D) Certification letter(s) from the department, if provided by a manufacturer,
7	to demonstrate that the mattress from the manufacturer is or was subject
8	to a department-approved mattress recycling plan. A retailer shall
9	provide access to a certification letter only if it is being used as proof of
10	compliance, pursuant to subdivision (b) of section 42993 of the Public
11	Resources Code that a manufacturer not listed on the department's
12	internet website is in compliance and may sell or offer for sale
13	mattresses in California.
14	(b) Provide the department with reasonable and timely access, as determined by the
15	department, to its facilities, operations, and any relevant records necessary to
16	determine compliance with this Article, upon request.
17	(1) Manufacturers, renovators, retailers, distributors, and recyclers will maintain
18	and provide access to records required by this Article for 3 years.
19	(2) Mattress recycling organizations will maintain and provide access to records
20	required by this Article for 3 years after submission of the annual report which
21	relies upon those records.
22	(c) The department may take enforcement action against any mattress recycling
23	organization, manufacturer, renovator, retailer, recycler, or distributor who fails to

1 §18971. Procedure for Imposing Civil Penalties.

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(a) Civil penalties may be administratively imposed in accordance with the procedures
outlined in the Administrative Procedure Act at Article 10 of Chapter 4.5 (commencing
with section 11445.10) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code.
(b) The accusation or complaint and all accompanying documents may be served on
the respondent by the following means:

- 8 (1) Personal service.
- 9 (2) Substitute service by using the same service procedures as described in
 10 section 415.20 of the Code of Civil Procedure.
- 11 (3) Certified Mail: For respondents who have submitted a mattress recycling plan, 12 certified mail or registered mail if the letter containing the accusation or
- complaint and accompanying material is mailed, addressed to the respondent
- 14 at the latest facility or mailing address(es) on file with the department. Proof of
- 15 service of the accusation or complaint shall be the certified mail receipts or
- registered mail receipts proving the accusation or complaint and
- accompanying materials were sent to respondent by certified mail or
- registered mail. For respondents who have not submitted or are not required
- 19 to submit a mattress recycling plan to the department, certified mail or
