The major changes are to provide additional time for fleets to make necessary equipment investments to comply with PERP. Portable Engine ATCM changes include new and updated control strategies. The proposed changes to the PERP Regulation allow implementation of the ATCM control strategies and related requirements. In addition, the PERP update will include new administrative requirements and revised fees that provide for comprehensive and full cost recovery implementation of both the ATCM and PERP Regulation.

Staff will present for Board consideration proposed amendments to regulations regarding procedures to certify and test vapor recovery systems used at gasoline dispensing facilities (GDF or gas stations). The certification systems include in-station diagnostics (ISD) similar to on-board diagnostic systems on cars that provide warning to gas station operators when there is a high likelihood of vapor recovery equipment failures so that repairs can be carried out expeditiously. Staff will propose a number of station and vehicle specific solutions to address ISD nuisance overpressure alarms that are experienced by GDFs primarily during periods when winter gasoline is sold (typically between November and March).

Staff will present for Board consideration amendments to the emissions control system warranty regulations and the emissions warranty information reporting program applicable to on-road heavy duty engines and vehicles. The proposed emission control system warranty amendments would lengthen the existing warranty periods to better reflect the longevity and usage of modern trucks, thus ensuring that any defects that cause engines or vehicles to fail to conform to applicable requirements are repaired at no additional cost to the consumer. The proposed emissions warranty information reporting amendments would require manufacturers to take corrective action (typically in the form of a recall or extended warranty) once the warranty claims rate for an emission control component exceeds the corrective action threshold, thus ensuring that any components with systemic failures are repaired timely and at no additional cost to the customer.

The proposed changes will align the regulations with changes from Senate Bill 833, which updated California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 14009.5. The changes limit DHCS' Estate Recovery (ER) program to the federally-mandated minimum. The regulations will limit ER solely to those services required by federal law (nursing facility services, home and community-based services, and related hospital and prescription drug services), limit ER to probated estates, eliminate ER for deceased Medi-Cal members that are survived by a spouse or registered domestic partner, add a hardship waiver criterion for homesteads of modest value, and change the interest rate for voluntary post death liens. Additional revisions to the regulations will be made to clarify ER's collection and substantial hardship waiver procedures.
