Disaster Response-Emergency Operations Account Request—COVID-19 Medical Supplies and Equipment

Pursuant to the provisions of Government Code section 8690.6, the following report is respectfully submitted.

Government Code section 8690.6 makes Disaster Response-Emergency Operations Account (DREOA) funds available, upon allocation by the Director of Finance, to state agencies for disaster response operation costs incurred as a result of a proclamation by the Governor of a state emergency.

On March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom proclaimed a state of emergency for an outbreak of a respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus, a disease now known as COVID-19. On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization determined that the COVID-19 outbreak is a pandemic. On March 22, 2020, the state secured a Presidential Major Disaster Declaration.

On April 7, 2020, we notified the Joint Legislative Budget Committee that the state was entering into a contract to provide a dependable supply of Personal Protective Equipment, specifically, medical-grade masks. In that letter, we indicated the Governor's Office of Emergency Services will provide an initial payment of \$495 million to secure supply of the masks. That initial payment was made.

Further, we indicated the balance of payments will be made as deliveries are received. The first shipment of medical-grade masks is underway, and the first post-delivery balance payment invoice will be due this week. Invoices are anticipated twice a week as deliveries of these medical-grade masks continue.

Accordingly, an augmentation of \$104.7 million using DREOA is necessary to continue paying the balance of the contract through mid-May as the state will receive nearly daily deliveries. With this augmentation, a total of \$599.7 million has been allocated for

this contract. The remaining unallocated balance will be required for payments after mid-May through late-June, as the state continues to receive deliveries of these medical-grade masks.
