## Control Section 11.90—Shift Allocations to Support the State's COVID-19 Response from the General Fund to the Coronavirus Relief Fund

Pursuant to the provisions of Control Section (CS) 11.90, Budget Act of 2021, the following report is respectfully submitted to update the Joint Legislative Budget Committee on the final expenditures of the Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) provided to California pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act (P.L. 116-136).

On January 6, 2022, California reported to the U.S. Treasury that the \$9.5 billion allocation was fully expended and that further adjustments are not anticipated. Expenditures include funds approved by the Legislature and allocated to counties, cities, local education agencies (LEAs), community colleges, as well as funding to reduce the spread of COVID-19 among the state's homeless, and to partially offset the cost of state disaster response including emergency food supplies, diapers, and support for child care centers. These expenditures are summarized in the chart below:

Subdivision (c) of CS 11.90 authorizes the Director of Finance to use CRF, including interest earned by the fund, to offset or reduce General Fund costs in the 2019–20, 2020–21, and 2021-22 fiscal years to support the COVID-19 response between March 1, 2020, and December 31, 2021. The state has earned a total of \$43.9 million in interest through December 31, 2021. Interest may only be used for the same purpose as outlined in U.S. Treasury guidance.

Attachment A summarizes the state offsets through December 31, 2021, totaling \$2.5 billion. This update reflects the addition of expenditures totaling nearly \$151.1 million to offset state COVID-19 response costs since the November 23, 2021 update. This includes \$72 million in 2020-21 costs for state staff redirected to contact tracing and vaccine coordination, increasing the total redirections to support these critical activities to \$172 million through June 30, 2021. The executive orders to reimburse various funds that initially paid salaries for redirected staff were posted on December 30, 2021.
