Amendment to Budget Bill Items 7100-001-0001, 7100-001-0588, and 7100-001-0870, Support, Employment Development Department

It is requested that Item 7100-001-0001 be increased by \$4,306,000, Item 7100-001-0588 be decreased by \$25,000, and Item 7100-001-0870 be amended to reflect these changes. These changes are requested for the following:

Nurse Education Initiative—An augmentation of \$4.5 million General Fund to establish six clinical simulation laboratories that will be used to provide clinical training to nursing students.

It is further requested that the attached proposed trailer bill language (Attachment I) be adopted to remove the funding cap for grants to establish clinical simulation laboratories in order to accommodate revised cost estimates.

Finally, it is requested that Item 7100-001-0870 be revised by adding a provision to allow the Employment Development Department to utilize a portion of the amount appropriated for the Nurse Education Initiative for administration costs (Attachment II).

Automated Collection Enhancement System—A reduction of \$194,000 General Fund, and a reduction of \$25,000 from the Unemployment Compensation Disability Fund, to reflect the updated timeline to implement the Automated Collection Enhancement System.

Employment Development Department Proposed Trailer Bill Language

Issue: Nurse Education Initiative

SEC. 1. Section 9619 of the Unemployment Insurance Code is amended to read:

9619. (a) (1) To the extent that funds are appropriated for this purpose in the annual Budget Act, the department may award grants to regional collaboratives for the creation of regional nursing simulation laboratories that will allow additional nursing students to have access to clinical educational facilities. No single grant made under this section may exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000).

(2) During the 2005-06 fiscal year, all grants made under this section shall be made for the creation of regional nursing simulation laboratories that serve rural areas.

(b) The department shall administer grants made under this section, and shall establish procedures and criteria for the awarding of those grants.

Employment Development Department Proposed Budget Bill Language

Item 7100-001-0870

Provisions:

XX. The Employment Development Department is authorized to use up to \$100,000 of the amount appropriated for the Nurse Education Initiative in Item 7100-001-0001 for costs associated with administering the program.



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Addition of Budget Bill Item 7350-490, Reappropriation, Department of Industrial Relations

It is requested that Item 7350-490 be added to reappropriate up to \$8,831,000 from Item 7350-001-0223, Budget Act of 2005, Program 30, Division of Workers' Compensation, for the Electronic Adjudication Management System.

This reappropriation is needed due to delays in the contract procurement process which will prevent the Department from encumbering these funds in the current year.

California Department of Industrial Relations Proposed Budget Bill Language

New Item

7350-490—Reappropriation, California Department of Industrial Relations. Up to \$8,831,000 of the appropriation provided in Item 7350-001-0223, Budget Act of 2005 (Ch. 38, Stats. 2005), is reappropriated and shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure until June 30, 2007.
