**Amendment to Budget Bill Items 1110-001-0205, 1110-001-0326, and 1110-001-0770,
Support, Department of Consumer Affairs**

It is requested that Item 1110-001-0326 be increased by \$464,000 to provide additional temp-help funding to the California State Athletic Commission (Commission). This funding will enable the Commission to hire additional athletic inspectors, on a two-year limited term basis, to properly staff boxing and mixed martial arts events in order to ensure the health and safety of athletes, staff, and the public.

It is also requested that Item 1110-001-0205 be increased by \$559,000 and Item 1110-001-0770 be decreased by \$131,000 to properly fund the Geologists and Geophysicists Program (GGP) under the Board for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors (BPELS).

In order to support the GGP's workload related to its regulatory, licensing, disciplinary, and enforcement functions, these funding changes will: (1) fund two additional Office Technicians, (2) reflect the redirection of an Associate Governmental Program Analyst position from the BPELS to the GGP, (3) properly allocate the costs of a current supervisor managing both BPELS and GGP employees, and (4) allow for the development of new geotechnical examinations and for contracting with external technical experts.

Amendment to Budget Bill Item 1730-001-0001, Support, Franchise Tax Board

Homebuyer Tax Credit (Issue 038)—It is requested that Item 1730-001-0001 be increased by \$822,000 and 9.0 positions to implement proposed provisions of Revenue and Taxation Code Section 17059.1 which provides for a tax credit for homebuyers of a qualified principal residence between May 1, 2010 and August 1, 2011.

Homeowners and Renters Assistance (HRA) Program Reduction (Issue 039)—It is requested that Item 1730-001-0001 be decreased by \$495,000 and 7.0 positions to reflect the cessation of the HRA Program. It is further requested that \$1,116,000 be shifted to the Tax Program, which reflects fixed IT mainframe costs currently allocated to the HRA Program, and which Franchise Tax Board will continue to incur despite the discontinuation of that program. Finally, it is requested that Schedule (2) of this Item be deleted.

Funding for the payment of HRA claims was eliminated in the 2008 Budget Act, and the final outstanding claims have been processed.

**Amendment to Budget Bill Items 1760-001-0666 and 1760-002-0666, Support,
Department of General Services**

It is requested that Item 1760-001-0666 be decreased by \$2,061,000 Service Revolving Fund to reflect the transfer of 9.0 positions from the Department of General Services (DGS) to the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO). These positions provide indirect services to the Telecommunications Division, which was transferred from the DGS to the OCIO effective May 10, 2009, pursuant to the Governor's Reorganization Plan #1.

It is further requested that Item 1760-002-0666 be revised to incorporate a technical correction to the provisional language to properly allocate the amount for Base Rental and Fees within this item. It is requested that Provision 1 be amended by reducing (a)(20) Marysville, District 3 from \$29,686,000 to \$6,175,000 and adding (a)(21) Central Plant in the amount of \$18.0 million and adding (a)(22) Library and Courts Renovation in the amount of \$5,511,000 (see Attachment A). The overall dollar impact of this adjustment is zero.

Addition of Budget Bill Item 1760-490, Capital Outlay, Department of General Services

It is requested that Item 1760-490 be added to reappropriate the unencumbered balances of appropriations for the Library and Courts Renovation project and the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Deuel Vocational Institute (DVI), Tracy, Hospital Building, Structural Retrofit project. Both projects are managed by the Department of General Services (DGS). The appropriations were included in the Budget Acts of 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2008.

As a result of the Pooled Money Investment Board's decision to freeze disbursements on interim financing for bond funded projects, DGS suspended all activities on the Library and Courts Renovation and the DVI, Tracy, Hospital Retrofit projects. The projects have resumed, however the corresponding delays make it necessary to reappropriate the unspent balances of the requested funds to allow DGS to fulfill its responsibilities for the identified projects moving forward.
