Addition of Item 2720-491, Capital Outlay, Department of the California Highway Patrol

Reappropriations (Issues 920 and 921)—It is requested that Item 2720-491 be added to reappropriate the following projects from the 2009 and 2011 Budget Acts (see Attachment 2) and to extend the encumbrance period through June 30, 2018:

- California Highway Patrol Enhanced Radio System (CHPERS): Replace Towers and Vaults Phase 1—Preliminary Plans and Working Drawings.
- CHPERS: Replace Towers and Vaults Phase 2—Construction

Of the 15 sites comprising the CHPERS Phase 1 project, two have encountered difficulties, necessitating this request to reappropriate preliminary plans and working drawings authority. One of these sites, Leviathan Peak, was removed from the project in 2011 and then restored in 2013 when it was determined that a local agency could no longer provide the tower and vault. Leviathan Peak will require an extensive environmental review process and design development to determine the best strategy for providing the power to the site. Once these tasks are completed, the United State Forest Service (USFS) is expected to approve a new long-term lease agreement to allow California Highway Patrol (CHP) use of the site, a prerequisite to construction of the project. The other site, Sacramento Mountain, requires an analysis of nearby peaks for placement of the tower and vault, as negotiations with the owner of the original site have proven challenging. For both sites, it is expected that construction funds will be necessary in fiscal year 2018-19. Because of the complexities facing these two sites, it is anticipated that design authority will need to be available through June 30, 2018.

Of the six sites comprising the CHPERS Phase 2 project, one site, Truckee, is no longer needed as the existing Truckee Replacement Office project includes a radio tower that will meet CHP's area needs. Consequently, CHP requests that the Truckee site be removed from the CHPERS Phase 2 project. Two other sites, Crestview Peak and Silver Peak, recently completed the environmental review process, will have signed leases with the USFS by the end of May, and are starting working drawings. These two sites should proceed to bid by the end of the calendar year. In order to keep these sites on schedule, it is requested that construction authority be reappropriated.

Addition of Budget Bill Item 3540-491, Capital Outlay, Department of Forestry and Fire Protection

It is requested that Item 3540-491 be added (Attachment 1) to reappropriate the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection's (CALFIRE) fiscal year 2014-15 minor capital outlay projects. This funding is for the following three projects: (1) High Rock Conservation Camp: Water Treatment System Upgrade, (2) Trinidad Fire Station: Install Water Connection, and (3) La Cima Conservation Camp: Replace Wastewater Treatment Plant. Unforeseen delays in completing geotechnical work have delayed design development. CALFIRE anticipates the construction contracts for all three projects will be awarded in approximately six to nine months. Reappropriation of these water-related projects will allow CALFIRE to address critical water quality and supply problems.

Amendment to Budget Bill Item 5225-491, Capital Outlay, Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation

It is requested that Item 5225-491 (see Attachment 1) be amended to reappropriate funds for the following project:

California Men's Colony: Central Kitchen Replacement—Working drawings and construction. This project was originally funded in the 1998 Budget Act and preliminary plans were completed in 2001, but the project was put on hold due to repurposing consideration of this prison. Since then, funding for working drawings and construction was appropriated in 2008 and reappropriated most recently in 2014. Completion of working drawings was delayed because of poor performance by the original architect and later-than-anticipated execution of a contract for the new architect to complete the working drawings. Working drawings are near completion and will be submitted to the State Fire Marshal for review shortly. Construction is expected to begin early in the 2015-16 fiscal year.

Addition of Budget Bill Item 6610-491, Capital Outlay, California State University

It is requested that Item 6610-491 be added to reappropriate the following projects and phases from the 2012 and 2013 Budget Acts:

- California State University (CSU) Pomona—Administration Building Replacement Facility—Working Drawings and Construction: The preliminary plan phase for this project has been delayed due to the need to resolve various design issues related to the relocation of the facility from the site originally identified in the campus master plan. It is anticipated that preliminary plans will be presented to the State Public Works Board for approval on June 15, 2015. A reappropriation is requested for extension of the encumbrance period to June 30, 2018, to proceed to the working drawings and construction phases.
- CSU Los Angeles—Administration Building Seismic Upgrade—Working Drawings and Construction: This project has been delayed in completing the preliminary plan phase, as the CSU seismic review board has required an extensive seismic analysis to determine an appropriate and code compliant solution for seismic strengthening. A reappropriation is requested for extension of the encumbrance period to June 30, 2018, to proceed to working drawings and construction.

Eliminate Budget Bill Item 7502-301-9730, Capital Outlay, Department of Technology

It is requested that Item 7502-301-9730 be eliminated. The 2015-16 Governor's Budget proposed \$206,000 for the preliminary plans phase of a project that would install a new cooling tower and a chiller at the Gold Camp Data Center. The need for this project was based on historical power consumption and cooling system utilization data. However, the Department of Technology recently performed a refresh of older equipment with more energy efficient units and this has resulted in decreased cooling needs in recent months. Based on the most recent cooling system utilization data, the Department of Technology has determined that it is not necessary to begin the proposed project in the 2015-16 fiscal year and has requested to withdraw this project from consideration.
