Amendment to Budget Bill Item 3900-001-0115, Support, and Addition of Items 3900-490 and 3900-491, Local Assistance, California Air Resources Board

Increased Litigation Costs—It is requested that Item 3900-001-0115 be increased by \$1 million to support civil lawsuit costs related to automobile industry violations. The number of cases that require the Attorney General's Office services and the complexity of challenges and defenses that require experts, discovery, travel to negotiations/court hearings, and factual analysis are time-consuming and require additional resources to support the increased costs. Having the ability to quickly respond, enforce, and begin litigation when manufacturers fail to contain harmful emissions from vehicles or any type of equipment sold in California, is necessary to protect the air quality in the state.

**Reappropriation**—It is requested that Item 3900-490 be added to reappropriate the unexpended balance in Item 3900-101-3228, Budget Act of 2017. This funding supports existing zero-emission off-road freight projects (see Attachment 1).

**Extension of Liquidation**—It is requested that Item 3900-491 be added to extend the period to liquidate encumbrances in Item 3900-101-3228, Budget Act of 2014 and Item 3900-101-3228, Budget Act of 2016 to June 30, 2022. This funding supports existing advanced technology freight demonstration projects (see Attachment 2).
