**Amendment to Budget Bill Item 3900-492, and Addition of Items 3900-493 and 3900-494, Support and Local Assistance, Air Resources Board**

This proposal includes requests for various adjustments to continue implementation of previously authorized programs and projects, as described below.

**Extension of Liquidation**—It is requested that Item 3900-492 be amended to extend the liquidation period of Item 3900-101-3228, Budget Act of 2017 and Item 3900-101-3228, Budget Act of 2018 until June 30, 2023 (see Attachment 1). This funding provides technical assistance grants to community-based organizations to support community participation in the program established pursuant to AB 617.

**Reappropriations**—It is requested that Item 3900-493 be added to reappropriate the unencumbered balances of the following items for the purposes specified, with funding available for encumbrance or expenditure until June 30, 2022 (see Attachment 2):

- Item 3900-001-0115, Budget Act of 2020 to support the integrated multi-pollutant emissions inventory project developed pursuant to Chapter 136, Statutes of 2017 (AB 617), and to provide technical assistance grants to community-based organizations to support community participation in the AB 617 program.
- Item 3900-101-3228, Budget Act of 2019 to provided technical assistance grants to community-based organizations to support community participation in the program established pursuant to AB 617.
- Item 3900-001-6054, Budget Act of 2014 and Item 3900-101-6054, Budget Act of 2018 to replace older, dirtier freight vehicles and equipment with cleaner technologies to maximize emission reduction benefits and support the deployment of advanced technology equipment that yields early or extra emission reductions beyond those required by regulations.

It is also requested that Item 3900-494 be added to reappropriate the unencumbered balance of the following item for the purposes specified, with funding available for encumbrance or expenditure until June 30, 2023 (see Attachment 3):

- Item 3900-101-6054, Budget Act of 2019 to replace older, dirtier freight vehicles and equipment with cleaner technologies to maximize emission reduction benefits and support the deployment of advanced technology equipment that yields early or extra emission reductions beyond those required by regulations.

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**Amendment to and Addition of Various Budget Bill Items, Support and Local Assistance, State Water Resources Control Board**

**Federally Designated National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System-Commercial Industrial and Institutional Stormwater Permitting Program**—It is requested that Item 3940-001-0193 be increased by \$606,000 and 3 positions ongoing to implement a new United States Environmental Protection Agency residual designation authority to regulate stormwater from currently unregulated commercial, industrial, and institutional facilities. The additional resources will allow the State Water Resources Control Board to develop and implement a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System general permit at the Los Angeles Regional Water Board.

**Augmentation to Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund, Site Cleanup Subaccount and School District Account**—It is requested that Item 3940-001-0439 be increased by \$200,728,000 and 5 positions, Item 3940-001-3264 be increased by \$804,000 and 4 positions, Item 3940-101-3134 be added in the amount of \$2 million (see Attachment 1), and Item 3940-101-3264 be increased by \$16,717,000 to expand and accelerate reimbursement of corrective action costs in the Underground Storage Tank (UST) Cleanup Program. The fund and associated accounts are available to assist UST owners and operators with the costs to clean up contaminated soil and groundwater caused by leaking petroleum USTs. To accelerate activity in this program, the Water Board is activating the remaining 800 claims from the Priority List and will require an increase in budgetary authority to accommodate the increased need associated with these claims. The additional resources will allow the Water Board to reimburse corrective action costs for eligible claimants and result in accelerated reimbursement for claimants.

**Amendment to Budget Bill Items 3970-001-0387 and 3970-012-0387, and Addition of Item 3970-492, Support, Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery**

**Reappropriation and Additional Funding for Bonzi Sanitary Landfill Closure**—It is requested that Item 3970-001-0387 be increased by \$2,636,000 and Item 3970-012-0387 be reduced by \$2,636,000 to provide additional funding for the closure of the Bonzi Sanitary Landfill and offset the increased expenditure by reducing the transfer amount from the Integrated Waste Management Account, Integrated Waste Management Fund to the Solid Waste Disposal Site Cleanup Trust Fund. It is also requested that Item 3970-492 be added to reappropriate up to \$4.2 million in Item 3970-001-0387, Budget Act of 2017, and extend the liquidation period to June 30, 2025 (see Attachment 1).
