Amendment to Budget Bill Item 2660-001-0042, Support, Department of Transportation (CalTrans)

FI\$Cal Onboard Planning—It is requested that Item 2660-001-0042 be increased by \$1,609,000 and 10 positions one-time to perform planning activities associated with Caltrans' upcoming migration to the FI\$Cal system. The resources will initiate the preliminary planning stage, including implementing the first steps of FI\$Cal's Master Department Workplan developed for Caltrans. Additionally, the resources will support workload related to a fit/gap analysis, documenting the "as-is" business processes, interface and conversion assessments, and Fiscal FI\$Cal Learning Center training for Caltrans.

Audits Program Transfer—It is requested that a net-zero, intra-item transfer be made to Item 2660-001-0042 to properly align audit resources for both the Office of the Inspector General Program (OIG) and the Administration Program. The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 established the OIG to maintain an independent and objective audit and investigation program for Caltrans and associated entities. Initially, most auditing functions at Caltrans were transferred from the Administration Program to the new OIG. However, the OIG has determined that some of the work that was transferred is better suited for an internal audit office, not an independent office led by an Inspector General. The requested change returns these resources to Caltrans' Administration Program.

# Amendment to Budget Bill Item 2720-001-0044, Support, California Highway Patrol

It is requested that Item 2720-001-0044 be increased by \$7,949,000 in fiscal year 2022-23, \$6,166,000 in 2023-24, \$1,945,000 in 2024-25, \$2,003,000 in 2025-26, and \$2,063,000 in 2026-27 and ongoing, to replace obsolete 9-1-1 and public safety radio communications audio logging systems currently in use at 25 California Highway Patrol (CHP) communication centers. The CHP is responsible for 25 communication centers throughout the state. The centers serve the public and allied agencies statewide as primary public safety answering points, responding to 9-1-1 emergency calls and radio transmissions. The current radio communications audio logging system is at end-of-life and is not compatible with Next Generation 9-1-1.

Section 14669.23 is added to the Government Code, to read:

## Proposed 14669.XX:

- (a) The Department of General Services, with the consent of the Department of the California Highway Patrol, may enter into a lease-purchase agreement, or lease with an option to purchase agreement, for a build-to-suit office facility to replace the California Highway Patrol area office in Santa Ana in the County of Orange. The new facility shall be located in the California Highway Patrol's Santa Ana service area on approximately five acres and shall be designed and built to standards prescribed in the Essential Services Buildings Seismic Safety Act of 1986 (Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 16000) of Division 12.5 of the Health and Safety Code). This replacement facility project shall have oversight, testing, and inspection in a manner consistent with state infrastructure projects. The facility shall be anticipated to contain approximately 41,000 square feet of office space together with ancillary improvements to include, but not be limited to, an automotive service area, a fuel island, a truck and bus citation clearance area, a communications tower with radio vault, public parking for the main building, and secured parking for patrol vehicles.
- (b) Any lease and all related agreements authorized by this section are subject to Department of Finance approval, the legislative notice requirements prescribed in Section 13332.10, and the Property Acquisition Law (Part 11 (commencing with Section 15850)).

Add the following provision to Item 2740-001-0044:

2. Notwithstanding any other law, \$4,655,000 of the amount included in this item shall be allocated upon order of the Department of Finance for the Enterprise Content Management Information Technology project. Stage 4 of the Project Approval Lifecycle Process for the project must be approved by the California Department of Technology prior to these funds being made available.
