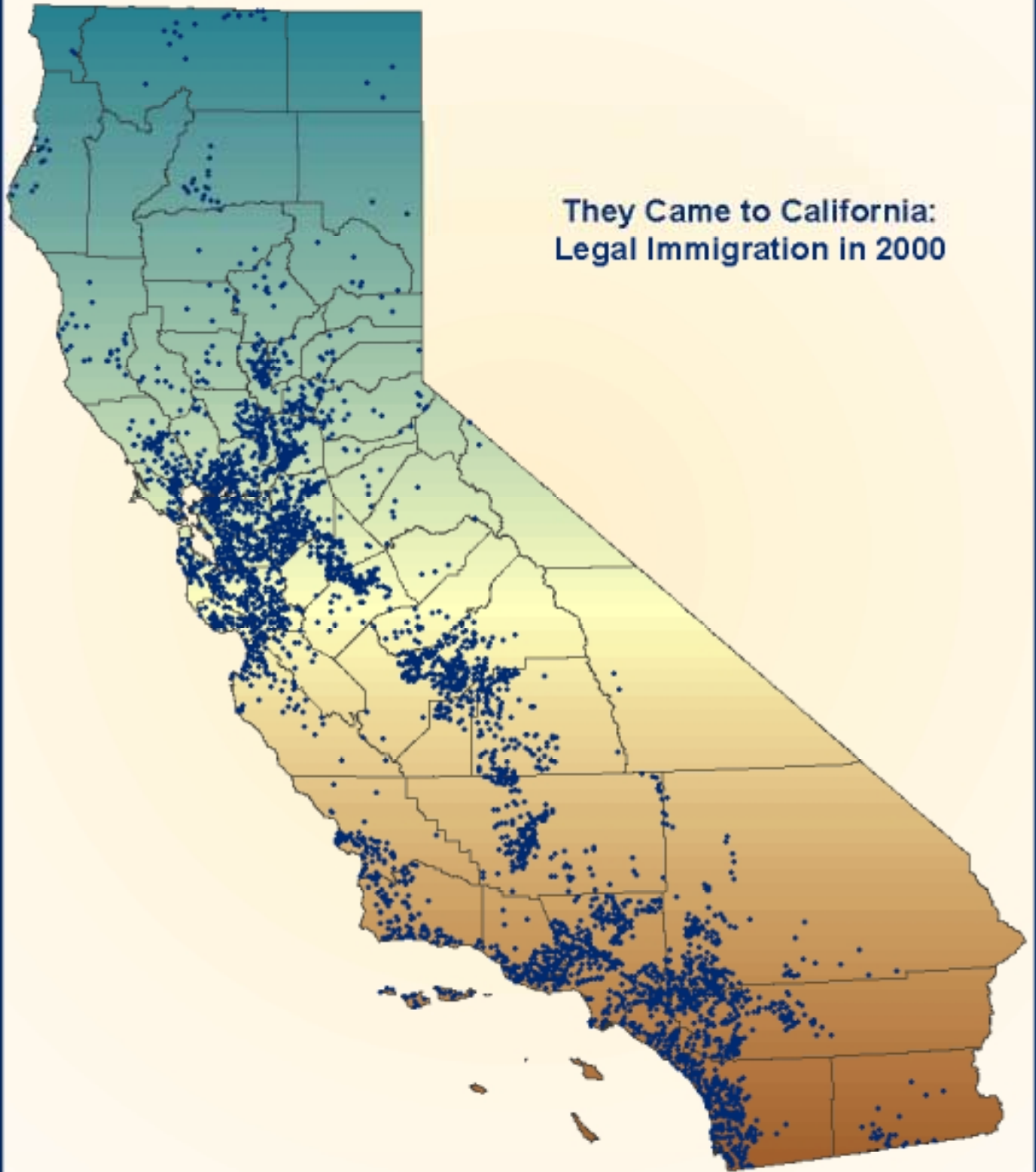
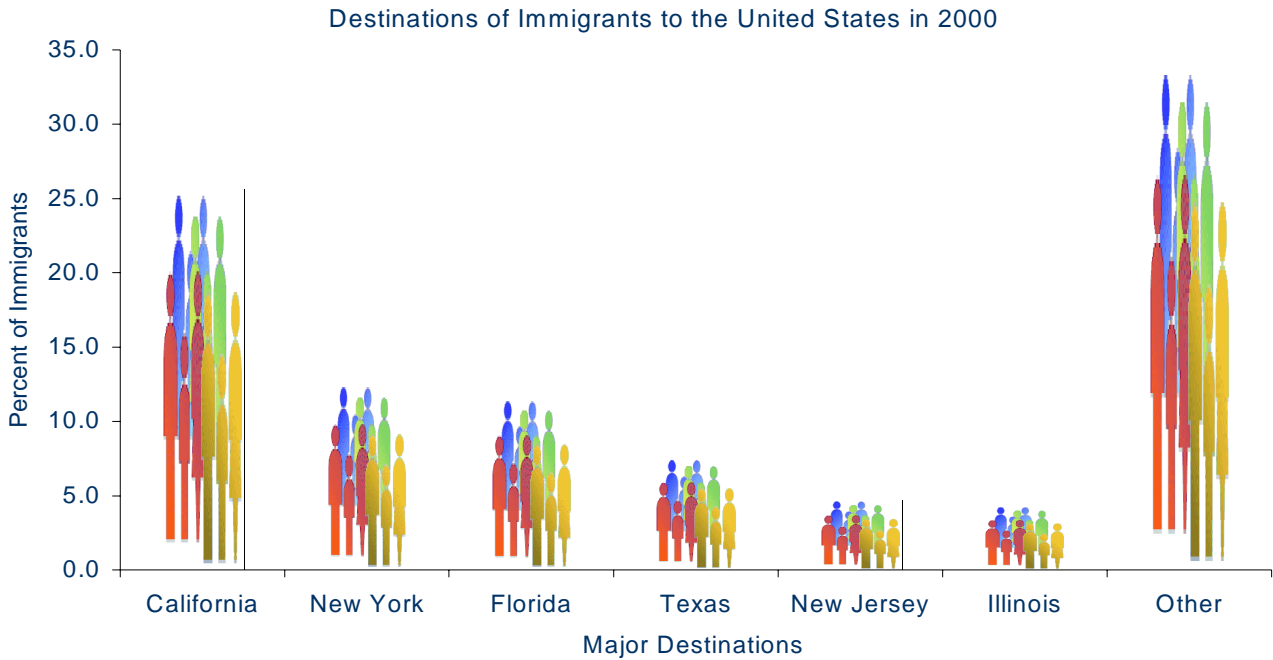


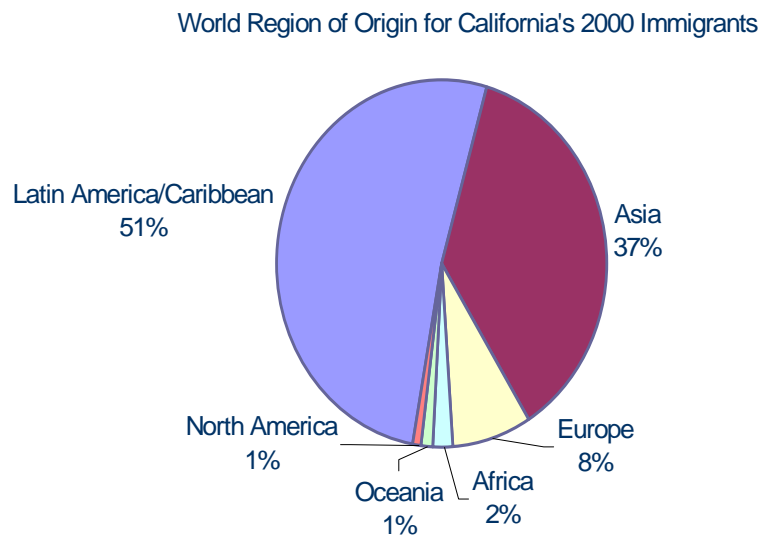
**They Came to California:
Legal Immigration in 2000**



The United States Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) admitted 849,386 immigrants as legal permanent residents in 2000. Seventy percent of these immigrants settled in six states. California was the state of residence for the largest number (217,576 or 26 percent) of these immigrants. Florida, New York, Texas, Illinois and New Jersey were the chosen residences of 40 percent of the new permanent residents while the remaining 34 percent settled in the other states.

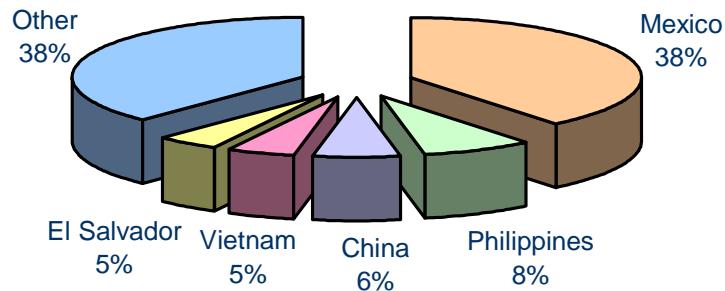


California received immigrants from 85 percent of the world's countries. Over half of the new arrivals were from Latin America and the Caribbean with another 37 percent coming from Asia. Europe, Africa, Oceania, and North America combined accounted for 12 percent of the 2000 immigrants.



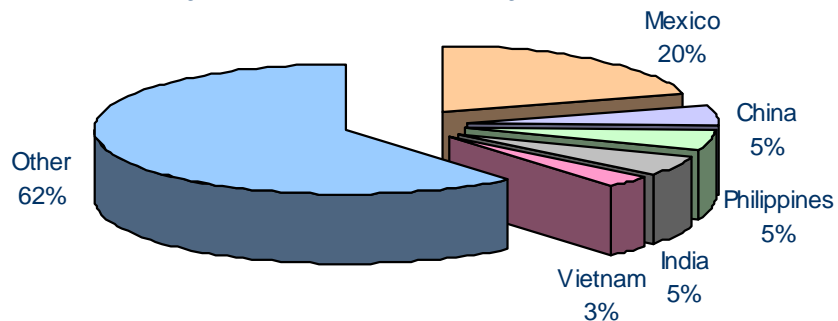
The origins of California's immigrants were diverse and they were also concentrated. Ten countries (Mexico, Philippines, China, Vietnam, El Salvador, India, Nicaragua, Taiwan, Korea, and Guatemala) contributed 75 percent of the state's 2000 immigrants. Almost 40 percent were from Mexico.

In contrast, over half of the immigrants to the United States came from ten countries (Mexico, China, Philippines, India, Vietnam, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Haiti, Cuba and Dominican Republic). Mexico was the primary country of birth for immigrants to this country in 2000, contributing 20 percent the total.

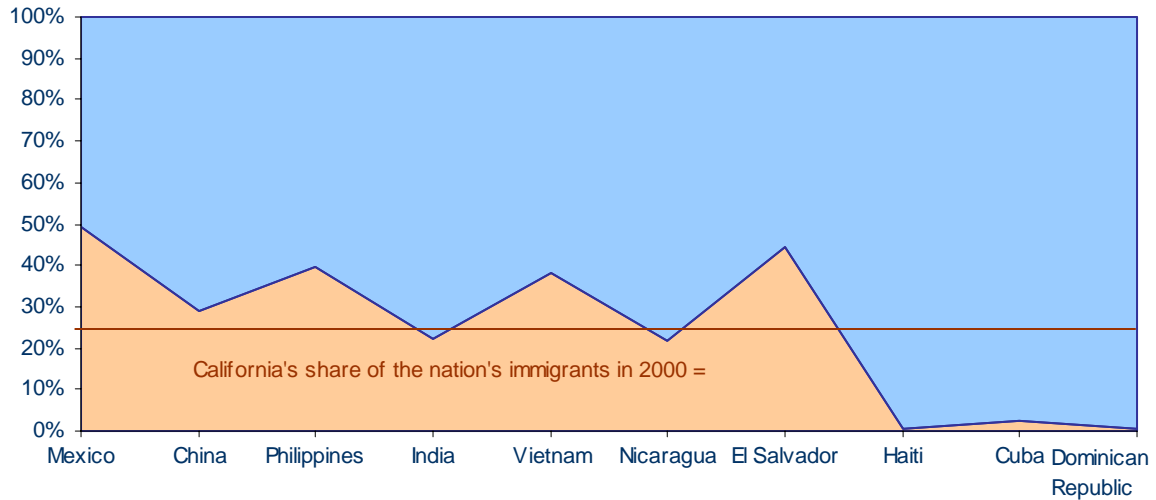
Origins of the United States' Immigrants in 2000



Overall, California received 26 percent of the nation's immigrants and was the preferred destination for about half of those who were born in Mexico and Taiwan, and around 40 percent of those born in Iran, El Salvador, Hong Kong, Guatemala, Philippines and Vietnam. The state also attracted around 30 percent of all immigrants born in China, Japan, Thailand, Cambodia, and Singapore. Ninety-four percent of the 2000 immigrants entered the United States from their birth country.

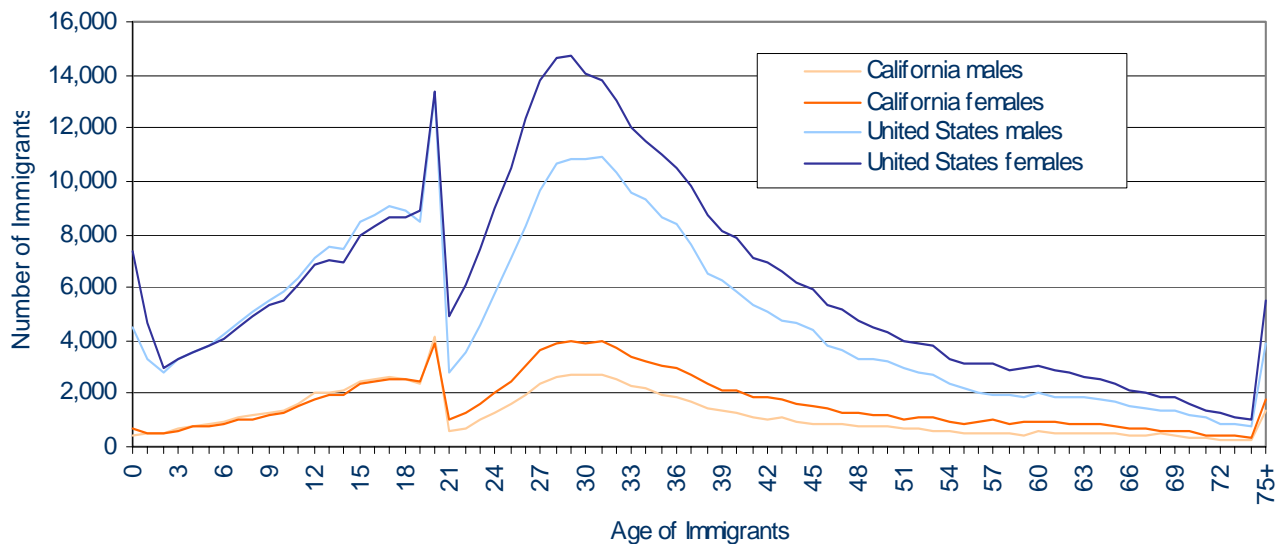
Philippines and China were the second or third most frequent country of birth for those entering the nation and the state. The next four most frequent origins for both areas were Vietnam, El Salvador, India, and Nicaragua. Countries rounding out the top ten for California were Taiwan, Korea, and Guatemala compared to those countries that contributed more heavily to the national population -- Haiti, Cuba and Dominican Republic. California was the selected destination for about 2 percent of those coming from Cuba and less than one percent of the immigrants from Haiti and Dominican Republic.

California's Share of Immigrants from the Major Sending Countries



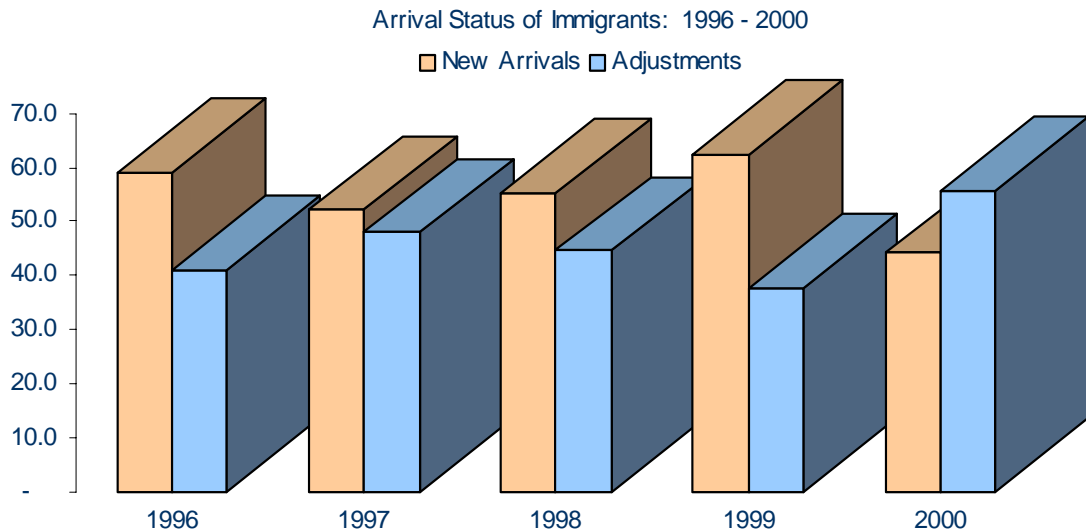
More females than males were admitted both in California and the United States. There were more females in each age except ages 3 through 18. Age and gender patterns were similar in the state and the nation. About 30 percent of the 2000 immigrants were minors under 21 years of age and another 30 percent were aged 30 through 40 years. The median age of all immigrants was 29.6 years compared to the median age of 33.3 years for all Californians. Among the top 10 sending countries, Mexico was the country of birth of the youngest immigrants with a median age of 26.8 while those from Korea and Japan were the oldest with median ages over 34.5 years. Over half of the 2000 immigrants were married, 40 percent were single, and 4 percent were separated, divorced or widowed.

Age and Gender of Immigrants to California and the United States in 2000

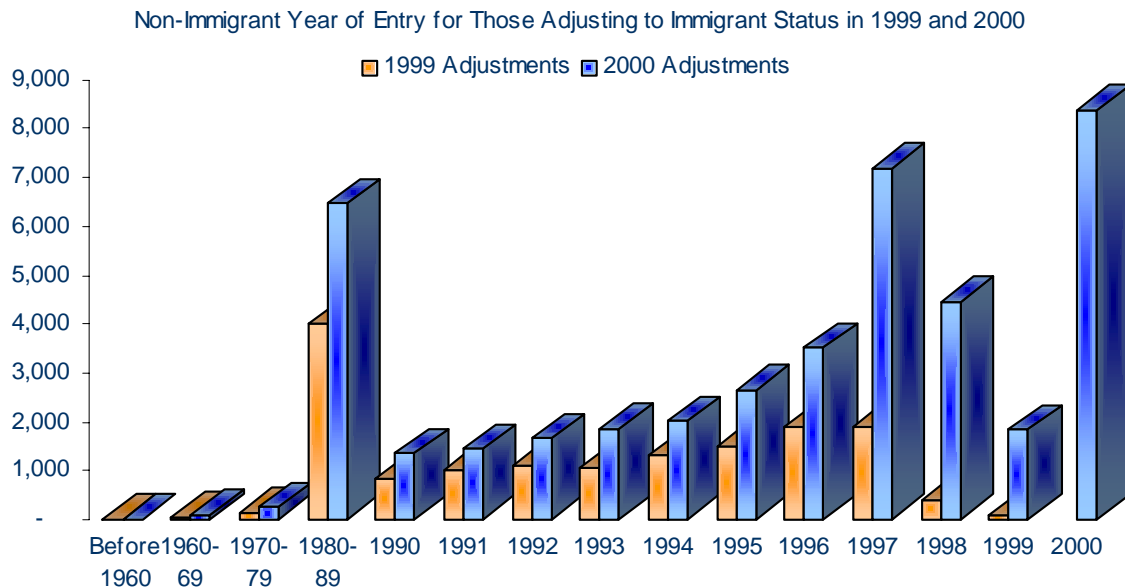


Fewer than half of the 2000 immigrants in California were new arrivals to this county. Annual statistics reported by the INS do not reflect only new arrivals. Each year some foreign-

born persons are admitted to the United States as immigrants while others enter in various non-immigrant categories such as temporary visitor for pleasure (tourists), temporary worker, refugee, or academic student. Some persons admitted as non-immigrants later petition the INS to "adjust" their status to an immigrant category. The total number of immigrants in California increased 35 percent between 1999 and 2000. The actual number of new arrivals was about 100,000 in both years while the number of those adjusting status doubled from 60,000 to 120,000 thousand. From 1996 through 1999, persons reported as immigrants included between 38 – 48 percent status adjusters. In 2000, over 55 percent of the immigrants were adjusters.

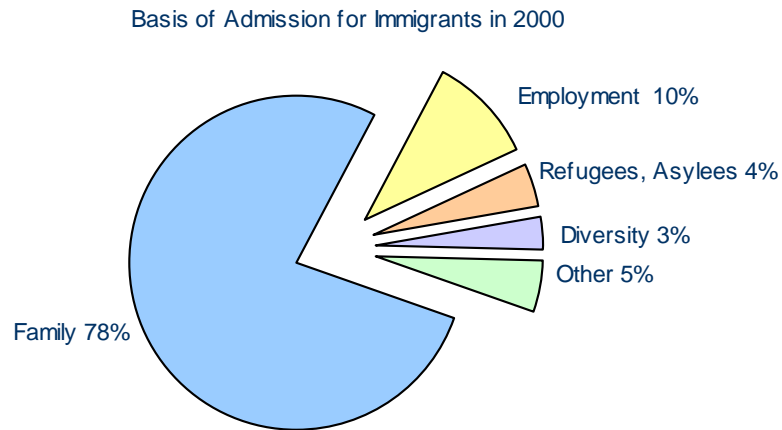


The INS has experienced an administrative backlog in processing requests to adjust status. As INS processes older petitions, persons who have been residing in the country, perhaps for several years, are reported as legal permanent residents or immigrants as of the date their petition for adjusted status is approved. Two-thirds of those adjusting status in 2000 arrived in a non-immigrant status prior to 1998, 15 percent arrived before 1990.

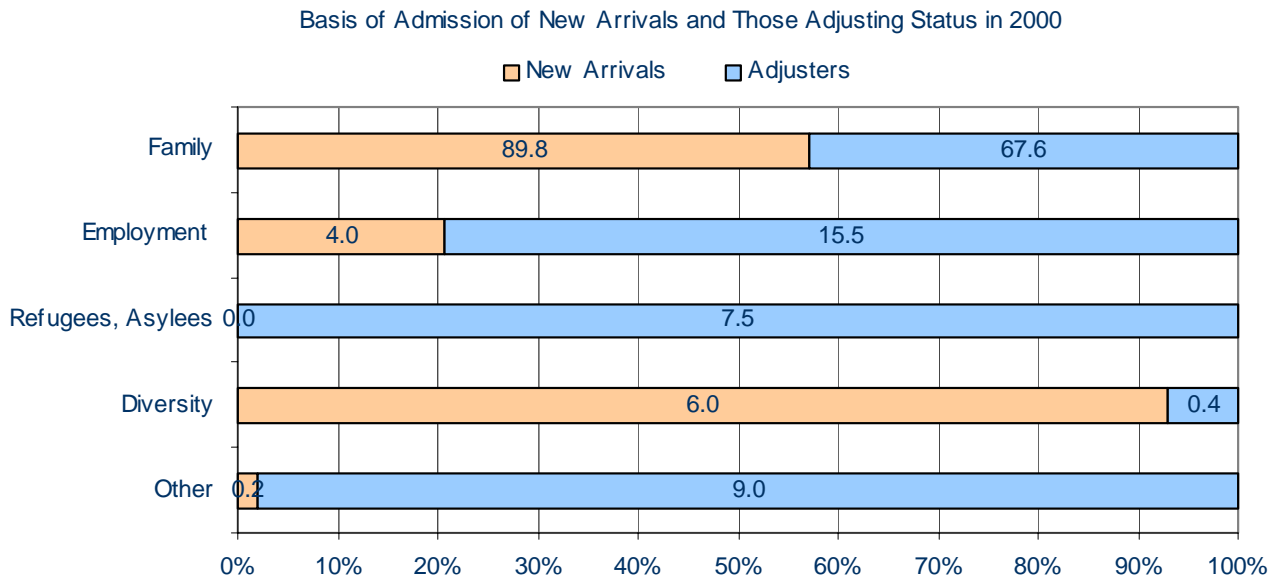


The INS reported one million adjustment of status applications still pending at the end of 2000. If one-quarter of those awaiting a decision currently reside in California, then 250,000 additional persons now in California may be granted legal permanent resident status in future years.

The majority of persons who became legal permanent residents in 2000 were family members of U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents. While family reunification is the primary basis for immigration, there are notable differences in the admission categories of the new arrivals and those who are adjusting status.



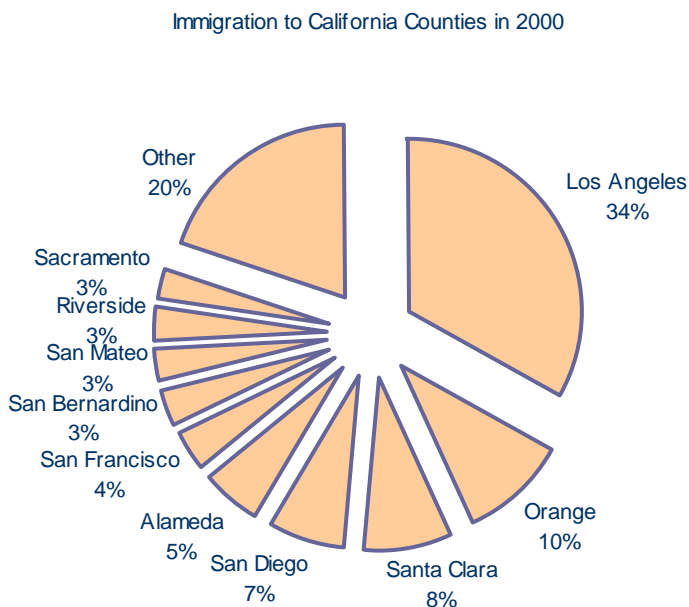
Ninety percent of the new arrivals immigrated based on family ties, 6 percent as diversity admissions, and 4 percent for employment reasons. In contrast, 68 percent of those adjusting status based their eligibility on family ties and 15 percent for employment purposes. Nearly three-quarters of the employment-based immigrants were male. Those immigrating for employment purposes came from 152 countries. Almost one-third were from India or China; another third came from Philippines, Korea, Mexico, Taiwan, United Kingdom, and Canada.



Refugees and asylees must have one year of continuous residence in the United States before applying for legal permanent residence. Over two-thirds of the refugees and asylees who adjusted status in 2000 were from Vietnam, Ukraine, Russia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Iran, and Cuba. Over 90 percent of the legalized refugees and asylees arrived in the United States during 1996, 1997 or 1998. The "other" category includes special admissions for Amerasians, Lautenberg Parolees, those admitted under the Nicaraguan Adjustment and Central American Relief Act, and those granted a Cancellation Of Removal.

One-third of the legal immigrants to California in 2000 settled in Los Angeles County.

Eighty percent of all immigrants settled in the top ten receiving counties: Los Angeles, Orange, Santa Clara, San Diego, Alameda, San Francisco, San Bernardino, San Mateo, Riverside, and Sacramento. All counties experienced some immigration in 2000.



Mexico provided the largest number of immigrants to all but three counties. In San Francisco, Mexico ranked sixth in immigrants behind China, Philippines, Nicaragua, Vietnam, and Hong Kong. Most immigrants to Solano County were from the Philippines, followed by Mexico. Nepal was the number one sending country to Trinity County; none of the seven immigrants were from Mexico. Immigrants from Mexico were most likely to settle in Southern California counties (Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, Riverside, San Bernardino), Santa Clara County, and agricultural counties (Fresno, Monterey, Ventura, and Tulare). Mexico contributed 65 to 85 percent of the immigrants to these agricultural counties.

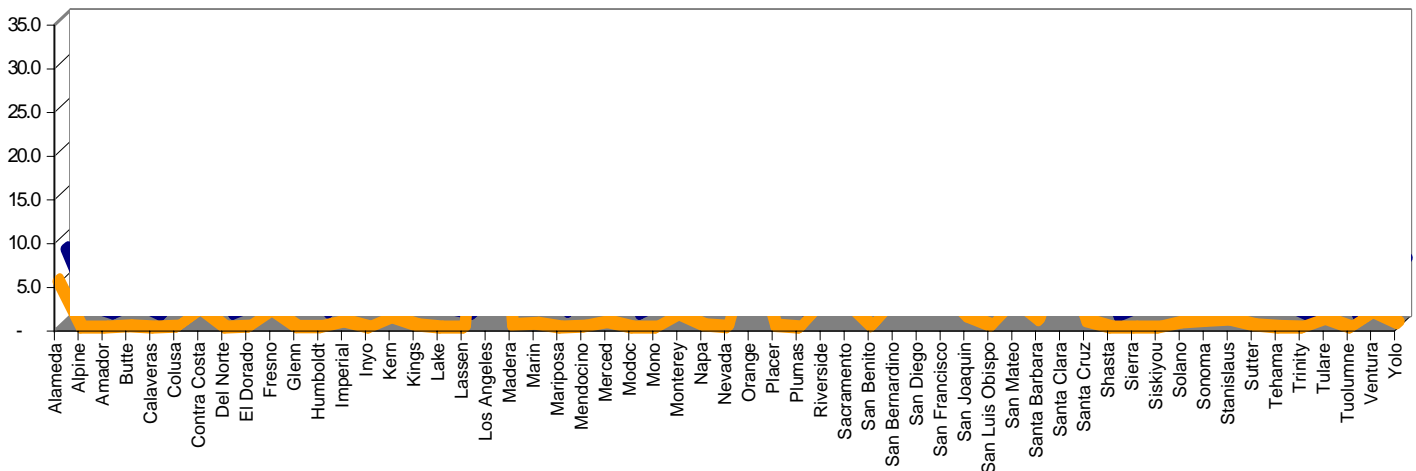
Los Angeles was the primary receiving county for immigrants overall and from most countries. Among the top 25 countries, those sending over 900 immigrants, Los Angeles was the leading destination. Many immigrants from Vietnam, India, Ukraine, and Fiji selected other counties as their preferred destination. Over half of those from Vietnam settled in Orange or Santa Clara counties. Over 40 percent of the Indians lived in Santa Clara and Alameda counties. Sacramento County was the primary destination of immigrants from Ukraine, nearly 40 percent. Two-thirds of the Fijians made their home in Alameda, Sacramento, San Mateo, or Stanislaus counties.

Notable migration streams have developed between some sending countries and California counties. Almost half of the arrivals from Laos now live in the central valley counties of Sacramento, San Joaquin, and Fresno. Sacramento was the number one destination for immigrants from Belarus, Estonia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Moldova, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, the former Soviet Union, and Uzbekistan. The Sacramento area, including neighboring Yolo County, is home to 35 to 55 percent of all immigrants from these countries. The area was also a primary destination for arrivals from Russia.

San Francisco attracted one-quarter of the immigrants from Ireland. Alameda County became home to over 20 percent of the arrivals from Afghanistan, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Kyrgyzstan, Liberia, and Yemen. San Diego attracted over half of the Iraqi people and nearly three-quarters of those from Somalia. In addition to Vietnam, Santa Clara County also received a significant portion (20 to 35 percent) of the immigrants from Bosnia-Herzegovina, Denmark, Portugal, Taiwan, United Arab Emirates, and Zambia.

Colusa County had the highest immigration rate, receiving 13.5 immigrants for each 1,000 persons residing in the county. San Francisco, Imperial, Santa Clara, and San Mateo counties also had immigration rates of 10 or more. The overall state rate was 6.4. Counties in the far north and those in the east central part of the state received the fewest immigrants and had the lowest immigration rates. The following chart illustrates differences in the proportion of immigrants and rate of immigration in the state's counties.

Forty-two California cities became home to one thousand or more immigrants in 2000. One-quarter of all the immigrants settled in six cities: The city of Los Angeles received nine percent of the immigrants followed by San Jose, San Francisco, San Diego, Santa Ana, and Sacramento.

These were highlights from the Immigration and Naturalization data on persons admitted or adjusted to legal permanent residence status in 2000. Tables and maps in the appendix provide more detailed information about the origin, characteristics and location of these immigrants.

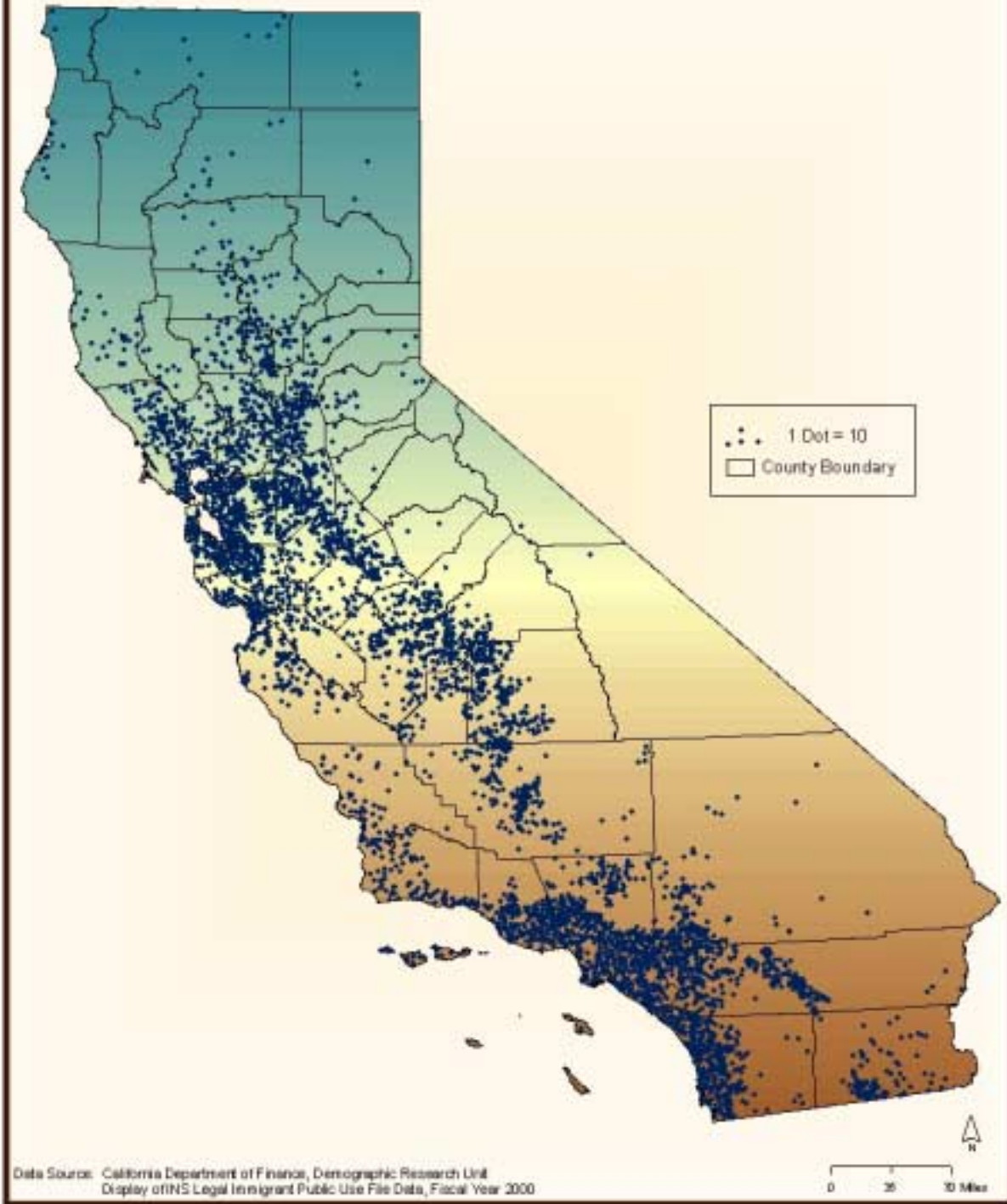

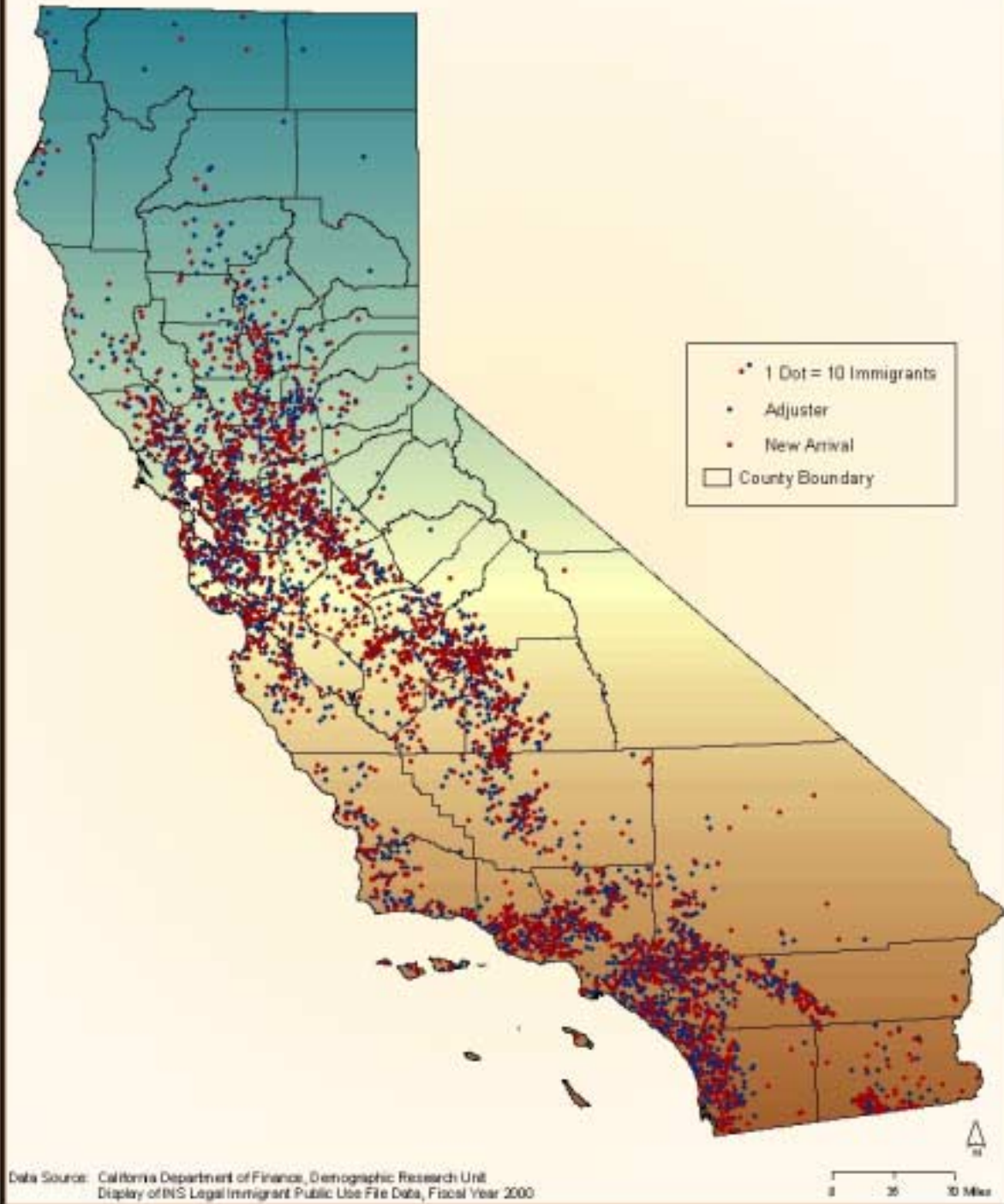

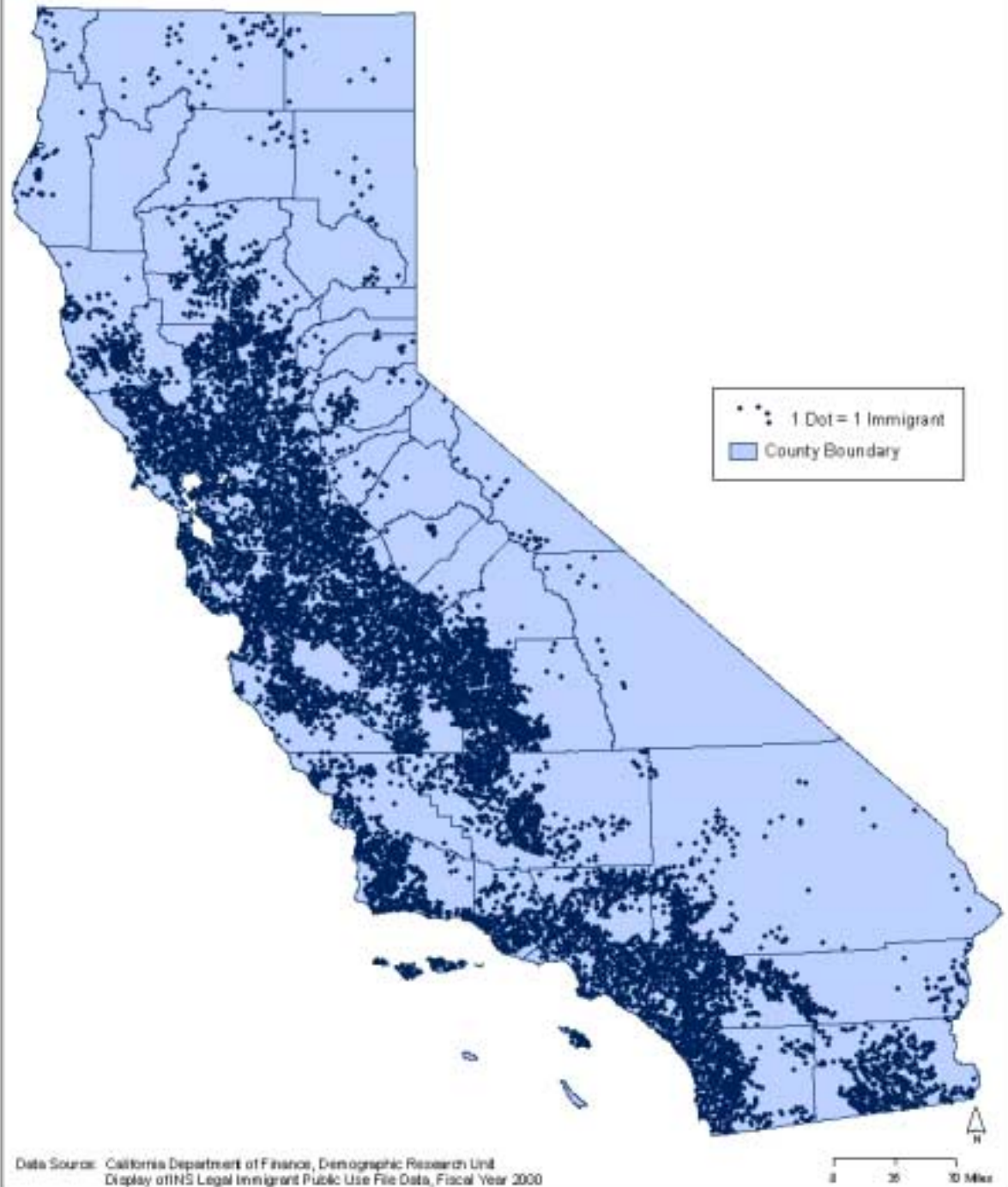
Map 1. Settlement Pattern of all 2000 Immigrants



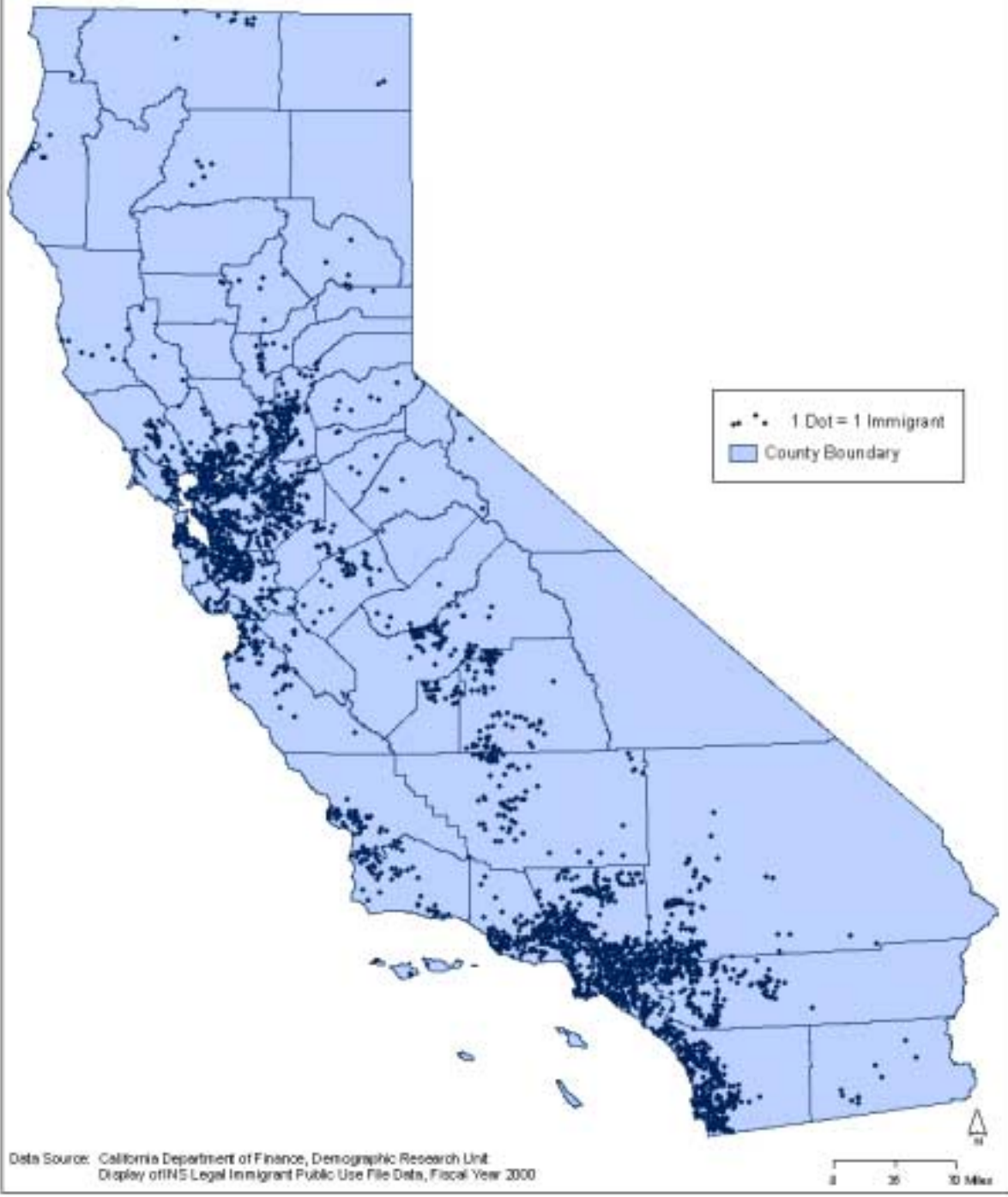
Map 2. Settlement Pattern of New Arrivals and Adjusters



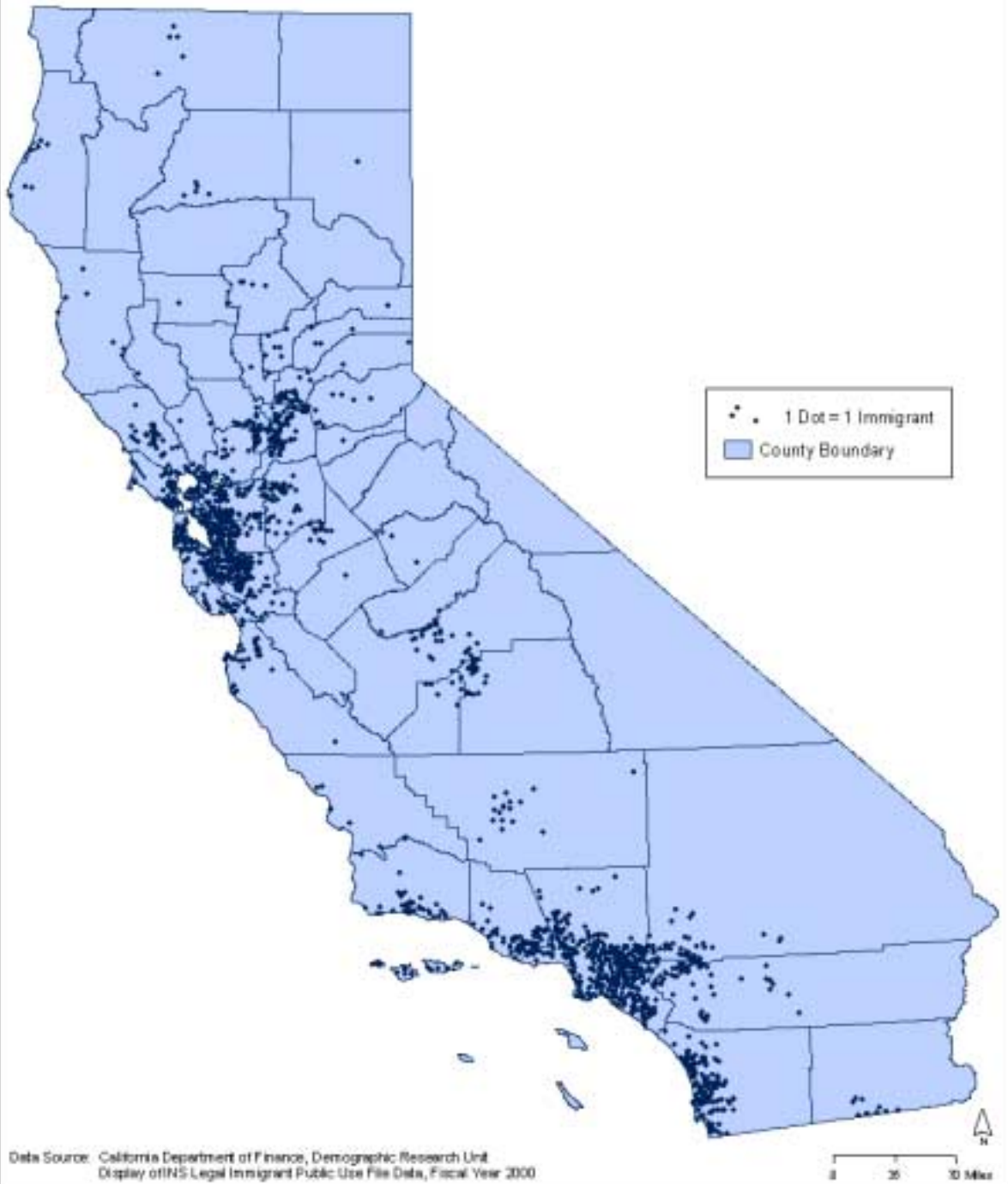
Map 3. Settlement Pattern of Immigrants from Mexico



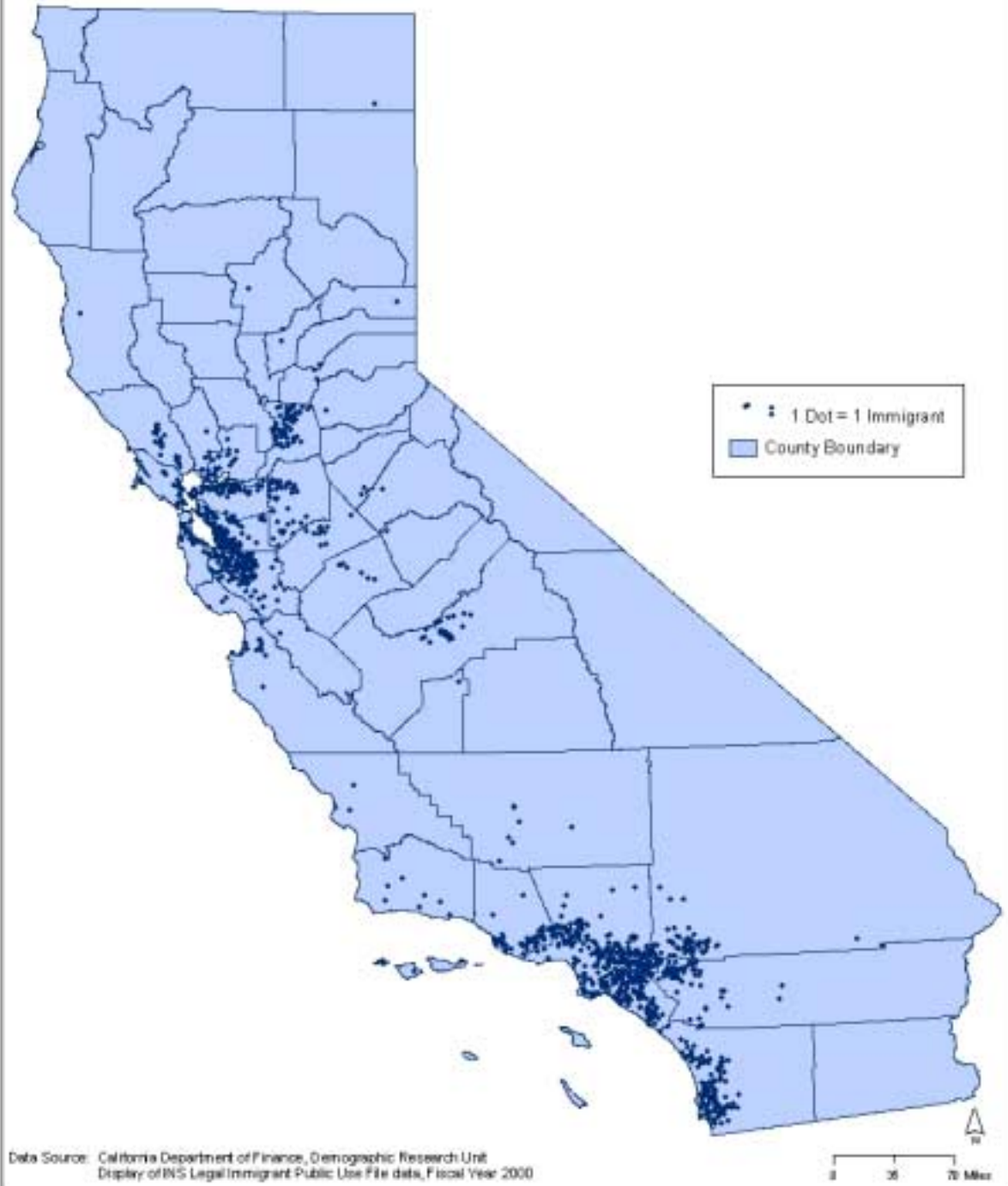
Map 4. Settlement Pattern of Immigrants from Philippines



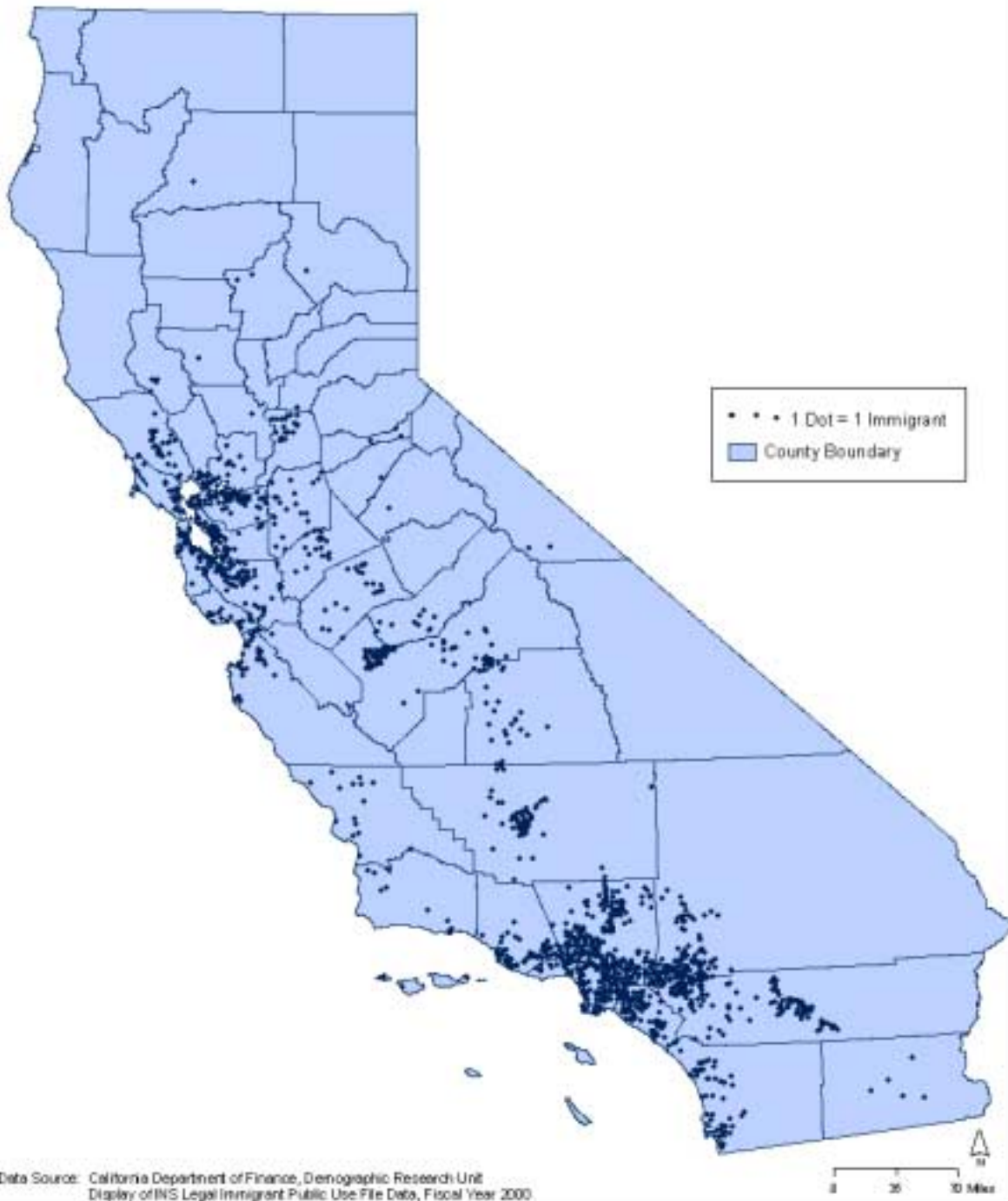
Map 5. Settlement Pattern of Immigrants from China



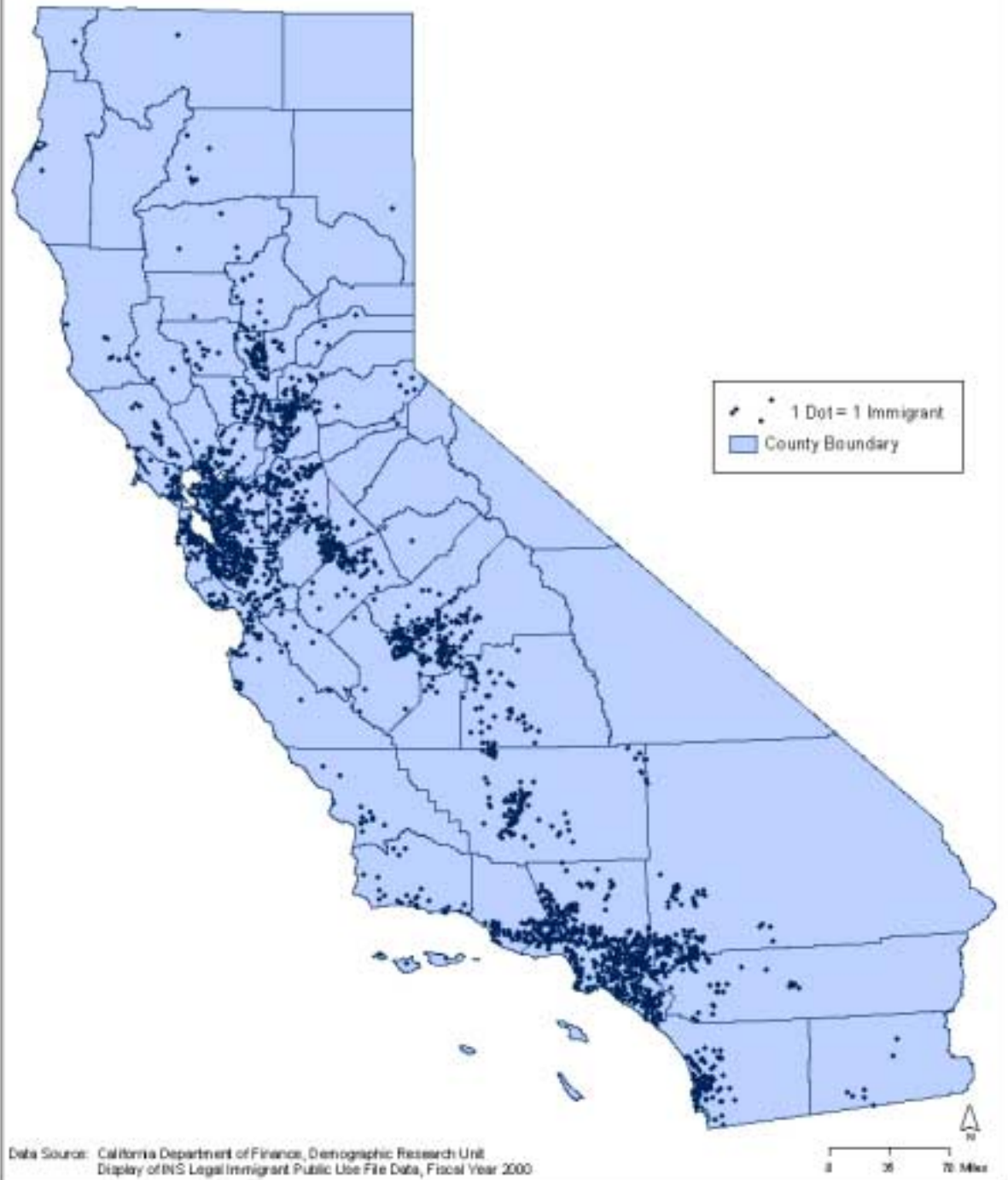
Map 6. Settlement Pattern of Immigrants from Vietnam

Map 8. Settlement Pattern of Immigrants from India



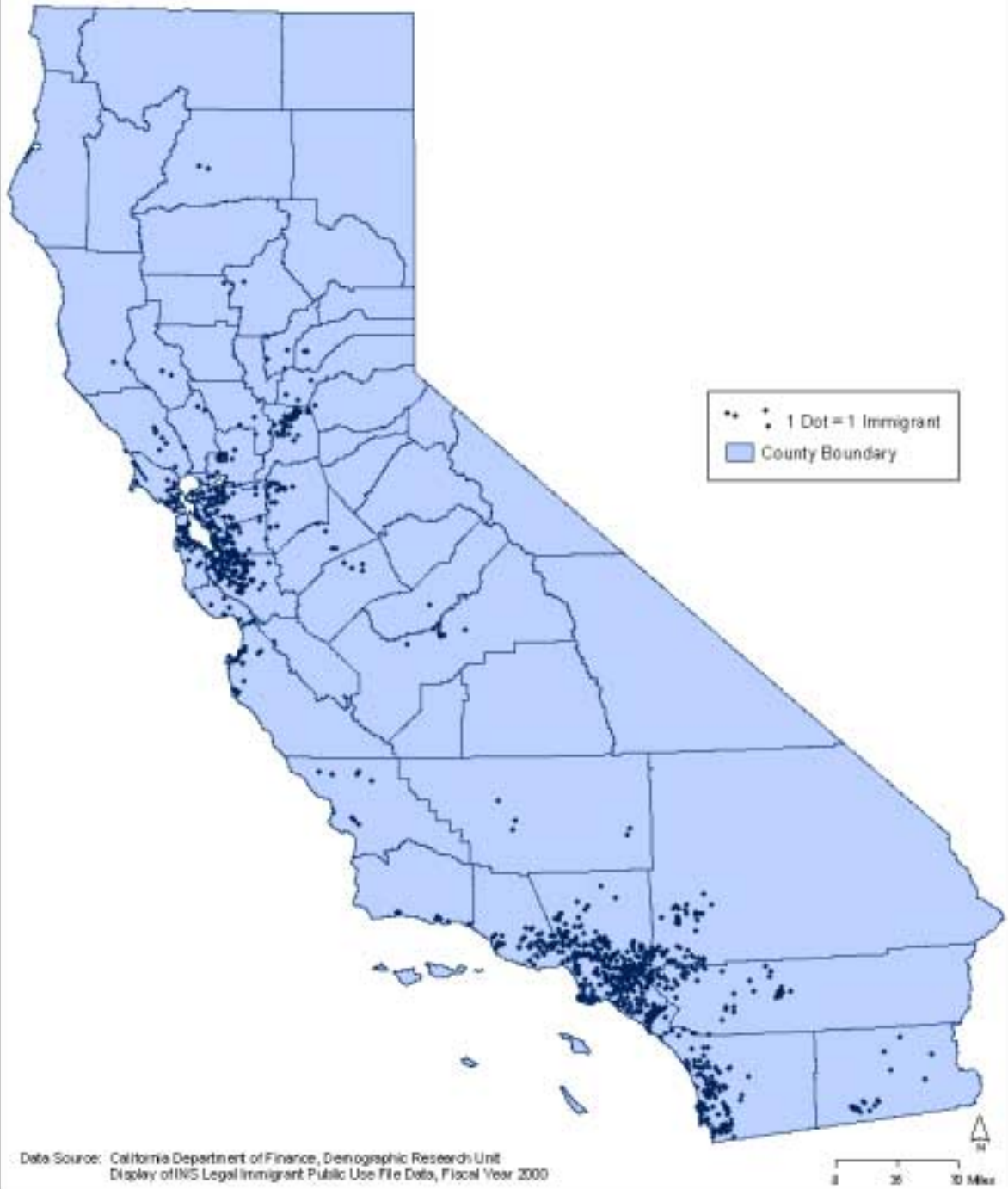
Map 9. Settlement Pattern of Immigrants from Nicaragua
